Many of you shared stories of your own struggles in receiving proper help for mental illnesses. Tonight, 13 on your side's Emma Nicolas shares the full story of how this one mother has spent the last 3 years getting denied care for her 12 year old daughter, who has been suicidal and diagnosed with bipolar disorder. When Melinda's daughter was 9 years old she threatened to take her own life on the school playground. Since then, now 12-year-old Destiny has been placed at in-patient facilities for brief stints more than a dozen times. As her mother continues to search for a long term solution. We reached out to the Michigan department of health and human services to see if there are other options when the sole state hospital for children is filled, they said there are other privately owned hospitals that accept Medicaid -- but say they aren't sure if those facilities are also filled. |

Among the 11 denied? Anxiety, Depression and Brain injury. In a 4 to 2 vote by the review panel, both anxiety and depression were denied. Most members of the medical marijuana review panel are licensed physicians who took into account public comments, research and their own expertise in casting their vote. But we've gotten many comments on Facebook from people who say they are shocked that those mental illnesses we mentioned were "not" approved. 13 on Your Side's Nina Desarro joins us now with more. |

Another covers Wyoming and the third covers parts of Grand Rapids and Walker. Only 20-percent of people infected will notice symptoms. They include headaches, body aches, joint pains and fatigue. Most people recover completely but fatigue may last for weeks or even months. There is no vaccine or cure for West Nile, so the best treatment is prevention. The health department recommends wearing a mosquito repellant that contains 10-to-35 percent DEET. |
| Crayon Warning | 8/9/18 at 6:00am .45 | As you prepare kids to head back to school... an advocacy group is warning parents about what type of crayons they buy. The U-S public research group education Fund says it found asbestos in Playskool brand crayons. They are now calling for that brand to be recalled. The group tested six brands for toxic chemicals. Only the Playskool 36-count crayons bought at a Dollar Tree store tested positive. A spokesperson for Playskool's parent company, Hasbro, told The Washington Post it is conducting a "thorough investigation" and reviewing lab tests. The post also reports Dollar Tree executives say their independent tests showed now asbestos. |

So far this season, those workers have collected a VERY high number of the type of mosquitoes that carry the virus. The virus was first discovered in 1937, in the Central African nation of Uganda. It was first detected here in the United States in 1999. The first U-S cases that year were in New York City. West Nile is a viral infection, typically spread by mosquitoes. Researchers at the "U-S Centers for Disease control" say there are "no" vaccines to prevent catching it and no specific treatment for the virus. And most people who are bitten by mosquitoes carrying West Nile "never" feel any effects. But those who do get sick, experience everything from flu-like symptoms to neurological issues. Avoiding being outside at dusk and dawn, when mosquito activity is high... and wearing light-colored long-sleeved shirts, and long pants. |
