Kent County West Nile Death	10/3/18 at 5:00pm :25	We have more breaking news in Kent County, where health workers say there's been another death due to the West Nile virus. The health department says the patient had been hospitalized with complications from the "mosquito- borne" illness. It's Kent County's second West Nile death of the year. Experts say the threat will last until there's been at least two or three good frosts, which kill off mosquitoes. They advise people going outdoors to wear repellants containing DEET, and avoid exposure at dawn and dusk.
Kids and Mental Health	10/10/18 at 5:00am 3:00	Today is World Mental Health Day and for some, mental disorders begin early in life but sometimes, go unchecked. This morning, we're about recognizing the early signs of a mental disorder and what to do next. Ashtyn Storms is an outpatient therapist with Cherry Health. 1) What are some common mental disorders children/young people struggle with? Anxiety disorders, Depression disorders, Disordered eating, Trauma. 2) What signs should I be looking for What are some red flags? 3) Many parents wonder, am I making the problem worse if I seek help? (There is still a stigma) 4) How early/when should I seek help? How do you know if it's simply pre-teen/teen hormones or a stage? 5) Do you go w/your child? What's normal for an appointment? Thank you Ashtyn. We are going to be speaking with you again next hour about how to find a therapist...following that interview Ashtyn and I are going to jump on Facebook live to answer any questions you might have about mental health. We also want to mention that tonight at 11pm 13 ON YOUR SIDE will be hosting another mental health panel discussion following the show "A Million Little Things". Four babies in Texas were taken to the hospitalization with botulism. Which is a serious illness caused by a toxin that attacks the body's, nerves. It makes it hard to breathe... and can paralyze, or even kill your child. Each of the babies in Texas had been given a pacifier with honey.
	11/20/18 at 6:00am	There is good news though, for people who suffer from peanut allergies. Researchers have entered a phase 3 trial of an immune system modifying medication called

Peanut Allergy Breakthrough	:25	A-R-1-0-1. It can be taken by mouth every day... And it delivers a targeted dose of peanut-derived material to desensitize people from having severe reactions. The study gave encouraging results suggesting that this medication can successfully desensitize children and teens who have severe peanut allergy.

State and county researchers will measure the amount of P-FAS in the blood of people who live in houses with contaminated wells. And if they find elevated levels... they will look at their health records to see if they can connect P-FAS to specific illnesses.

The CDC says nearly all kids get RSV by the time they are two... but parents should not worry unless you have these symptoms: trouble eating

		or drinking, severe cough that interferes with sleep. Severe cases can lead to respiratory failure and even death. There is no vaccine for RSV. The C-D-C says the best thing parents can do is keep a close eye on symptoms.
Legionnaires in Hastings	12/28/18 at 5:00am :30	13 is On Your Side... with a health alert out of Barry County. The water at Spectrum Health Pennock Hospital in Hastings has tested positive for Legionella... Which causes a severe form of pneumonia called Legionnaire's disease. Our partners at the Battle Creek Enquirer say the water was tested when a second case of the disease was found in hospital patients last month.

Judges can still sentence juveniles to life in prison, but only in the rarest of cases.
