I. Issue: Healthcare

Takata, the maker of millions of allegedly faulty airbags finally gave in to federal pressure to recall 34 million cars and trucks so that the airbags can be tested. The airbags that have been tested so far indicate that they can explode with so much force that they are deadly. They cause shrapnel to go flying through the car. Six people have lost their lives because of those airbags, one person was severely injured in a crash and she was only going 25 mph. More than 100 other people have been injured in crashes involving Takata airbags.
