<u>07/05/2016 at 16:00...Kresta in the Afternoon...120 minutes...</u> Broadcaster, journalist, author and public speaker, Al Kresta takes a closer look at current events, issues, and ideas. In the first hour, Al talks with Peter Herbeck, of Renewal Ministries, about how parishes can reveal the kingdom of God, especially since parishes are one of the most important means by which the truths of the Church are shared.

In the second hour, Al talks about several major news stories, including terrorist attacks in Iraq and Saudi Arabia, an accusation that Donald Trump used anti-Semitic artwork in a tweet and the announcement that Hillary Clinton will not be charged for her email use. Also, during this hour, Al interviews Monica Miller, of Citizens for a Pro-Life Society, about an organized demonstration being organized at the GOP Convention to Defund Planned Parenthood.

In the first hour, Al talks with Matthew Bunson about the Democratic National Convention, which is in full swing in Philadelphia. Michelle Obama delivered a rousing speech last night, and former president Bill Clinton will headline tonight's speakers. Matthew & Al discuss this convention. So, Fr. Jacques Hamel was celebrating Mass this morning in a suburb of Rouen, France when the church was stormed by two ISIS fighters. The attackers slit Fr. Jacques' throat and held four people hostage before being shot dead by police. Al discusses this incident with Robert Spencer.

In the second hour Al talks with Cardinal Raymond Burke on a wide-range of topics, including his memories of Vatican II, his impressions of Pope Francis, the current state of the Church and much more.

Chimeras are animals that have been injected with human DNA and scientists hope they will one day be an easy source for organ donations. Is this research ethical? What do these policy changes entail? These are the topics Al and Fr. Tad discuss. Also Al talks about answering Jihad – is there a better way? San Bernadino. Paris. Brussels. Nice. The list of Islamic terror attacks in the West continues to grow, and it's even worse in the Middle Eastern countries – another attack in Turkey this weekend that killed at least 53 people. There's no doubt the innocents were slaughtered in the name of Allah, but do the terrorist's actions actually reflect on the religion of Islam? Al talks about the many questions surrounding Jihad with Nabeel Qureshi.

In the second hour, Al looks in the rearview mirror at the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment, which went into effect this week in 1920. How did the women's movement compare to the civil rights movement, and how did they differ? Al discusses this issue.
