Three more were sent to a hospital. It was reported that the people involved had ongoing issues with each other and they arranged to meet at the park to settle their differences. A fistfight began and someone took out a tire iron or baseball bat. Two males were sent to the hospital with head injuries and one man was stabbed in the back with a broken ice scraper.

The Dept. of Ag is preparing to treat the water with a copper chemical that is supposed to kill the mussels. The affected area of the river will remain closed until further notice.

Idaho Fish and Game has finished their assessment after treating a six mile stretch near Twin Falls in October. The state was trying to eliminate harmful Quagga mussels but the treatment also killed nearly seven tons of fish in just two weeks. Biologists discovered a 100 percent mortality rate in sturgeon and near 100 percent mortality in Northern Pike minnow and yellow perch. Largemouth bass and bluegill appear unaffected.
