### **A. American History / Biography**

The Klondike Gold Rush

Broadcast on January 6 at 8pm      Duration: 60 minutes

Renowned as the richest gold strike in North American mining history, the Klondike Gold Rush (1896-1899) set off a stampede of more than 100,000 people on a journey to the gold fields of Canada's Yukon Territory. Personal stories of success and failure shed light on the harsh realities of life in the Yukon, and present-day characters reveal the Klondike still resonates with the frontier spirit.

Klansville USA: American Experience

Broadcast on January 13 at 9pm      Duration: 60 minutes

The reasons North Carolina became home to the America's largest Ku Klux Klan organization during the 1960's are examined.

American Masters 2705: August Wilson, the Ground on Which I Stand

Broadcast on February 20 at 9pm      Duration: 90 minutes

The legacy of August Wilson, the man some call America's Shakespeare, is explored. From his roots as an activist to his work on Broadway, Wilson's rich theatrical voice and work is recalled by James Earl Jones, Viola Davis, Laurence Fishburne and other luminaries.

The Jewish Journey: America

Broadcast on March 5 at 8pm      Duration: 90 minutes

Jewish life in the old country and the establishment of communities in America are highlighted in this documentary. The reasons behind the leaving of home countries, journeying to the United States and subsequent accomplishments are examined.

Carole King: The Library of Congress Prize for Popular Song

President Obama, Billy Joel, James Taylor and more celebrate songwriter Carole King, whose career has crossed six decades. The performance was recorded in the East Room of the White House.

Cosplay! Crafting a Secret Identity

Broadcast on February 4 at 1pm      Duration: 60 minutes

A mainstay of "geek culture" for years, cosplay (a contraction of the phrase "Costume Play") has emerged from the shadows of the occasional sci-fi convention into the mainstream, now common at fan conventions around the country. Cosplay involves fans dressing like their favorite fictional characters, and the more intricate and exact the costume is, the better. The workshops and lives of people who take fantasy costuming to a professional level are explored.

Shakespeare Uncovered 203: The Taming of the Shrew with Morgan Freeman

Broadcast on February 6 at 9pm      Duration: 60 minutes

Award-winning actor Morgan Freeman sets out to understand how and why "The Taming of the Shrew" was written.

Motown 25 (My Music)

Broadcast on March 6 at 9pm      Duration: 120 minutes

Hosted by comedian Richard Pryor, “Motown 25: Yesterday, Today and Forever” celebrates the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Motown with footage not seen on television in more than 20 years. Featuring reunions of Smokey Robinson & The Miracles, The Supremes, The Temptations and the Jackson 5, with the first televised introduction of Michael Jackson’s famous moonwalk.

### **C. Environment / Nature / Geography**

Nature 4003: Wild France

Broadcast on January 7 at 8pm      Duration: 60 minutes

The wild side of France is revealed in a journey from the Pyrenees to Corsica. Breathtaking photography shows wolves, boar and even bears living among France’s many mountains, valleys and forests.

Earth a New Wild 101: Home/Plains

Broadcast on February 4 at 9pm      Duration: 120 minutes

Humankind’s changing relationships with the large animals that live alongside us are investigated. The peril of dangerous animals and their habitats still exist, but there is proof that large fauna and humans can live together on this planet. The wild is different today, but it is one which all creatures depend on.

Nature 3206: The Last Orangutan Eden

Broadcast on February 25 at 8pm      Duration: 60 minutes

The work being done to save the wild orangutans in the jungles of northern Sumatra is documented. In a swamp forest and World Heritage Site known as Suaq Balimbing lives a unique social band of wild orangutans who use tools, share food, forage together and create their own distinct culture.

### **D. Politics / Government**

Frontline 3304: Gunned Down, the Power of the NRA

Broadcast on January 6 at 10pm      Duration: 60 minutes

How the National Rifle Association uses its political power to stop gun regulation in America is investigated. With accounts of the school shootings in Newtown and Columbine, and the attack on Congresswoman Gabby Giffords, this episode examines why Washington has not acted on the national trauma over gun violence.

The Reagan Presidency

Broadcast on February 16 at 1pm      Duration: 60 minutes

This portrait of the 40<sup>th</sup> US President covers the Iran-Contra affair, the end of the Cold War, the air traffic strike of 1981, and the invasion of Grenada. Notable Reagan staffers, members of Congress, journalists and others representing a variety of political perspectives and opinions discuss the legacy of Reagan’s successes and failures.
