2021

Live Broadcasts, Saturday Mornings 9a-11a. Host: Rev. Al Sharpton

June 26<sup>th</sup> – Rev Sharpton welcomes; W Franklin Richardson of 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist Church Mount Vernon NY. NYC District Atty; Alvin Bragg (first African American elected to the position). Brad Lander: newly elected NYC Comptroller.

Issues covered include NYC Policing, lack of African American firms controlling asset management dollars for New York City.

**June 19<sup>th</sup>** – “Juneteenth Special with NYC Atty David Yearwood.

Issues covered include a history of Juneteenth and the significance of the National Holiday. Rev Sharpton discussed the state of the African American diaspora.

**June 12<sup>th</sup>** – “Get out the vote” rally with Rev Sharpton including Maya Wiley, Eric Adams and other candidates for NYC public office.

Issues covered include information on “Rank Choice Voting” and an opportunity to question candidates running for various NYC offices including Mayor, Comptroller, District Atty and City Council.

**June 5<sup>th</sup>** – Rev Sharpton welcomes Deon Powell, VP of Economic crisis initiatives for National Action Network and Author/TV personality/Activist; Judge Greg Mathis.

Issues covered include a discussion on community policing in NYC and media coverage of the George Floyd Policing Act and Voting Rights Bill.

**May 29<sup>th</sup>** – Rev Sharpton welcomed guests Dr. Tawana Guilford

Issues covered include Police Reform and “get out the vote efforts” for the upcoming Mayoral Primary.

**May 22<sup>nd</sup>** – Rev Sharpton welcomed guests including members of George Floyd’s family and President of the NY chapter of the NAACP, Hazel Dukes.

Issues Covered include the anniversary of George Floyd’s murder and George Floyd Day.

**May 15<sup>th</sup>** – Rev Sharpton welcomes Michael Hardy; Chief Legal Council for the National Action Network.

Issues covered include mentoring, youth engagement in politics and activism. Developing youth leaders.

**May 8<sup>th</sup>** - Rev Sharpton welcomes guests; Pastor Jason Hendrickson of Restoration Tabernacle Church in Brooklyn. State Atty General Alvin Bragg.

Issues covered include a Mother’s Day weekend tribute to women in the activism movement.

**May 1<sup>st</sup>** – Rev Sharpton welcomes guests; Rev Michael Johnson Pastor of South Baptist Church of Elmhurst Queens.

Issues covered included a recap of the yearly National Action Network Convention and issues discussed in the over two dozen panels that took place but on-site and virtually.

**April 24<sup>th</sup>** – Issues covered include lack of access to broadband in urban areas. Health care options in urban areas.
