Alma Reaves Woods

Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles, Project Fatherhood and Motivated Mothers

The Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles (HACLA) is a state-chartered public agency. It provides the largest stock of affordable housing in Los Angeles. In Watts, HACLA is spearheading the redevelopment of the Jordan Downs Housing Project. The redevelopment includes a "Families First" Initiative, which helps its residents develop personal responsibility, accountability and employability.
