> > **Request for Extension of STA**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Relevant Radio, Inc. ("RRI"), by its counsel, respectfully requests an extension of Special Temporary Authority ("STA"), originally granted on March 24, 2020 (File No. BSTA-20200320AAD), to allow KIHU(AM), Tooele, Utah (Facility No. 35687) ("Station") to operate with parameters at variance from the terms of its license.

As previously reported to the Commission, on March 17, 2020, a massive earthquake hit the Salt Lake City, Utah area. One of the Station's towers, which is used for the Station's critical hours and nighttime patterns, collapsed during that earthquake. Since that time, the Station has been able to remain on the air during those periods, but at reduced power and with parameters at variance. The Station's daytime pattern has remained unaffected.

Unfortunately, matters beyond RRI's control have made it impossible for the Station to operate pursuant to the terms of its license. RRI has been in regular contact with the owner of the collapsed tower (who is unaffiliated with RRI), and RRI understands that the tower owner has made extensive plans for reconstruction.

Since the time of the most recent grant of the extension of STA, RRI has learned that the tower owner has received approval from the Federal Aviation Administration to erect a new, 197foot tower, and is in the process of acquiring the materials necessary to commence construction. Until the new tower is erected, the Station will have to continue operating with parameters at variance from its license.

Based on the foregoing, a grant of this STA extension request is in the public interest because it would allow the Station to remain broadcasting at all times, broadcasting emergency and other information to listeners in Tooele, UT and the surrounding areas, until normal operations can be restored. RRI will advise the Commission when the Station is operating pursuant to the terms of its license.

RRI hereby certifies that neither it, nor any party thereto, is not subject to a denial of federal benefits that includes FCC benefits pursuant to Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. § 862.
