Wild Ltd is a half hour conservation series, and in each episode the cameras follow Game Ranger Michelle Garforth-Venter, on her adventures both on land and under the water. Michelle meets researchers and veterinarians and learns about their work - suggesting job opportunities in the conservation world. Michelle always teaches about the anatomy of the species at hand, the conservation listing and why / how we can better preserve their population numbers. Each episode is designed to reveal to children the value of wild spaces and the creatures that live within.

REAL LIFE 101 - TARGETS AGES 13-16 YEARS

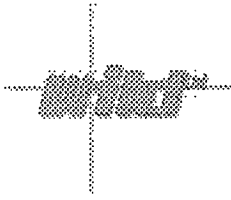
AIRED: SUNDAYS @ 7:00AM-- A HALF HOUR PROGRAM

Wild Ltd is a conservation series that travels thru Southern Africa to the Unites States in search of conservation heroes and interesting species, all with an urgent call to action. Join Wild Ltd as conservation journalist Michelle Garforth goes in search of unique species. A series of high animal adventures that brings you up close and very personal.

Wild Ltd Episode descriptions:

EPISODE 101 – (LEAP OF FAITH)

Conservation Journalist Michelle Garforth visits Kwazulu Natal in South Africa to learn more about the frog species that are croaking to tell us something. Frogs are an important indicator species and a colorful part of our ecosystem. Join her as she meets some very interesting frogs, who have a very important message to convey.

EPISODE 102 – (WHITE OAKS)

Wild Ltd visits White Oaks, an American facility that looks after animals that have been classified as close to extinction. There we meet some seldom seen animals that are about to disappear off the face of our planet. Join conservation journalist Michelle Garforth as she takes a closer look at some of the animals that you might never see in the wild.

EPISODE 103 – (ERINDI CROCS)

Conservation journalist Michelle Garforth has to complete two important tasks in this exciting episode of Wild Ltd. The first is to relocate a rather toothy character, and the second is to collar a cat. Join her as she meets up with some world class South African veterinarians who try to save the world one animal at a time.

EPISODE 104 – (CHEETAH CHECK UP)

Wild Ltd visits De Wildt Cheetah Research Center in South Africa where we learn why stressed out cheetahs display exactly the same symptoms as humans – so if you think stomach ulcers are unique to us overworked humans, you’re wrong! Join conservation journalist Michelle Garforth as she learns why cheetahs are under so much stress.

EPISODE 106 – (SAVING THE AFRICAN PENGUIN)

Arguably the planet's most charismatic creatures – African Penguins are proudly South African. But the numbers of these tuxedoed seabirds are declining. Wild Ltd visits SANCCOB seabird rehab center in South Africa to find out what is being done to help distressed penguins. Join Michelle Garforth as she gets happy feet.

EPISODE 107 – (TO CATCH A CAT)

The leopard is one of the most graceful creatures in our animal kingdom, but their mortality rate is unacceptably high. Wild Ltd follows a project that aims to identify the causes of death for these awe inspiring creatures. Join conservation journalist Michelle Garforth as she follows a female leopard and her cub.

EPISODE 108 – (PORCUPINE REPORT)

They are quirky and weird looking and love nothing more than rooting around for juicy bulbs. Yet these shy creatures are being persecuted for their quills to create items of decor for our homes. Join Michelle Garforth for the porcupine report – as Wild Ltd explores the problems they face and the solutions being implemented.

EPISODE 109 – (AN OCEANIC JOURNEY)

Wild Ltd journeys to the far southern Cape of South Africa, a land of fynbos, vast sands and time suspended. The southernmost tip of Africa is home to a treasure chest of marine ecology, from 60cm pyjama sharks, to the sizable white shark – join conservation journalist Michelle Garforth on an oceanic journey.

EPISODE 110 – (BATTLING ADVERSITY)

Bats are literally dying to tell us something. Join Michelle Garforth-Venter as she busts the myths about these tiny flying mammals. Bats form a quarter of all mammal species, you find them everywhere except for the north and south poles. And chances are if you live in a house, you have bats roosting in your roof. Catch Wild Ltd to find out why these tiny mammal species are such an asset.

EPISODE 111 – (PASSAGE TO FREEDOM)

One of the biggest threats to our natural heritage is the loss of wild spaces. Many animals end up in rehabilitation centers for the rest of their lives. 11 Baboons have been saved from this fate and are being relocated to a reserve in Pongola. Join Michelle Garforth-Venter and Wild Ltd where she accompanies a troop of baboons to start a new chapter in their lives.

EPISODE 112 – (A RARE SIGHTING)

While there are only about 300 desert adapted black rhino left in Africa, their numbers are some of the only that are on the increase. Join Michelle Garforth-Venter as she visits Namibia, a land of startling contrasts and rare beauty where we come across more than a few treasures in our quest to find the rare desert black rhino.

EPISODE 113 – (DESERT WONDERS)

Namibia is a land of startling contrasts. At first this harsh landscape is seemingly lifeless, but on the contrary – it is a treasure trove of life. Join Michelle Garforth-Venter as she experiences desert life through the eyes of big and small desert creatures.

Speed is the name of the game. Jarod explores fast animals and why their speed helps them to survive.

Animal Giants (#302)

Size matters – especially when it comes to survival. Jarod explores large animals and how their size contributes to their ability to survive.

Camo, Ammo & Other Amazing Skills (#303)

Jarod explores animals that use different methods of protection and camouflage to help them survive.

Family Ties (#304)

Jarod explores animals that share a strong resemblance to human habits or anatomy. From an interest in shiny objects to opposable thumbs, these animals can seem just like us.

Survival of the Fittest (#305)

Jarod explores animals that have evolved to be particularly well suited to their environments. From rapidly changing animals to those that have changed little over millions of years, these animals are an excellent fit for their environment.

Creepy Critters (#306)

Jarod explores animals people might tend to think of as “creepy,” and looks at how their distinctive appearances and habits help them to survive in nature.

Animals in the Extreme (#307)

Jarod explores animals that are able to survive in extreme environments. From bitter cold to scorching heat, these animals are uniquely suited to their unusual habitats.

Great Animals with Gross Habits (#308)

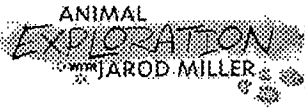
Jarod explores animals and some of their lifestyles, habits or mannerisms that people might tend to think of as “gross.” From eating carrion to projectile poop, these animals have some unusual behaviors.

Unusual Alias (#309)

Jarod explores animals with unusual names and how they earned them. For example the Bearcat is neither a bear nor a cat – so why is it a Bearcat?

Animals in the Nose (#310)

Jarod explores animals that have distinctive noses whether for their great sense of smell, the unusual uses, or simply the size or shape of their nose.



Animals with Attitude (#311)

Jarod explores animals that have a fierce disposition and the way that "attitude" helps them to survive in the wild.

Animals Actors (#314)

Jarod explores animals that work in the entertainment business. See the bear that appears in Semi-Pro; the tiger from Gladiator and more.

Cool Coats (#315)

Jarod explores animals with exteriors that function in interesting ways; from body armor to water resistance and camouflage these are definitely some cool coats.

The message is simple one: "If your friend is driving recklessly, say something." To help deliver this message, the campaign has enlisted the help of the talented comedians Fred Willard, Rob Riggle and Rachael Harris for the latest television PSAs. Each new PSA portrays the comedians as teenagers and highlights their 'unique' way of speaking up.

IV. CRIME PREVENTION

- **ON THE ROAD-OFF THE PHONE:** WZTV aired a PSA provided by the National Safety Council (NSC) and CTIA-The Wireless Association. The National Safety Council (NSC) and CTIA-The Wireless Association announced a joint education campaign – focused on teens – to explain the dangers of distracted driving and to tell them when they're "On the Road, Off the Phone. Distracted driving is an issue for everyone, but teens are the highest risk group and texting is a very high-risk behavior.
- **CYBERBULLY "CHICKEN"** -:30 (second spot) WZTV aired a PSA provided by the messenger chatting with friends and uploading photos, videos, and music to websites. The campaign focused Online bullying. Online bullying is called cyber-bullying, which happens when

teens use the Internet, cell phones, or other devices to send or post text or images intended to hurt or embarrass another person. Cyber-bullying is a problem that affects almost half of all American teens. Parents are offered ways to stop cyber-bullying. Parents can start by talking to kids about the issue and teaching them the guidelines that will help prevent cyber-bullying from happening to them or someone they know.

- **WILDFIRE SEASON:** WZTV aired a PSA provided by Smokey Bear Wildfire Prevention (Ad Council). Since 1944, Smokey Bear has been the symbol of the protection of America's forests from fire. More than 60 years later, his famous words of wisdom "Only You Can Prevent Wildfires" continue to be at the center of one of the most successful PSA campaigns in our nation's history.
