Section I: Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues in Montana this quarter:

- A. **HIGHER EDUCATION COST CRISIS**: Combining the area's teacher shortage with many watching their finances, many Universities and Colleges in the community are having to decide between additional layoffs or an increase in tuition in an industry already criticized for being too expensive.
- B. **ER VISIT INCREASE**: Local Hospital Facilities, already under strain due to the pandemic and the rise in flu cases, saw a marked increase of ER visits during the holidays this season. Some believe it was due to more families being willing to travel and come home and some equate it to more activity due to lessened stress of COVID-19 and wanting to be active and visit family.
- C. **CANNABIS**: Adult-use sales are scheduled to begin at the start of the New Year. In addition, President Biden has wiped out federal marijuana convictions for thousands of Americans.
- D. **REMOTE WORK**: It's reported that 58% of those employed across the country have the option to work their positions remotely at least part of the week. In Danbury, CT there are currently 800-900 "at home" positions posted to job boards.
