Participants are also encouraged to wear blue to show support for kids in foster care in honor of Foster Care Awareness Month.

This week on Wild About Animals...a scientist on vacation saves the life of a humpback whale...a prison in Philadelphia allows inmates to train unwanted dogs for adoption...we visit the oldest zoo in the United States and discover a new way to experience primates...and a bird observatory in Idaho lets the public get close to some amazing raptors.

Episode #134 (5/03/15)

This week we visit the beautiful Pacific Northwest. Our show begins right outside of Seattle, Washington where a local animal rescue facility performed emergency surgery on a black bear cub with a collapsed lung. Then it's over to the famous Salmon Ladders in Seattle to get a look at how innovation and nature have co-existed for salmon over a hundred years in one of the main shipping paths in North America. From there it's off to the Columbia Gorge with the Oregon Zoo as they release young western pond turtles back into the wild. And finally we look at amazing program that spans from the Oregon Zoo to Uganda, Africa teaching kids the importance of wildlife.

Episode #135 (5/10/15)

This week we go down under to Australia. First up we look at the unique Lumholtz Tree Kangaroo of Queensland. Then we visit a hospital set up to treat and rehabilitate local Queensland frogs. After that we visit thousands of butterflies at the Australia Butterfly Sanctuary. The show wraps up in the Australian Outback learning about a group of volunteers helping to rehabilitate injured wildlife in the Northern Territory.

Episode #136 (5/17/15)

This week on Wild About Animals we head to the Midwest prairie and study it's inhabitants with some students from Iowa State University. We also check out the efforts of the San Diego Zoo's conservation program to save the California Condor.

Episode #137 (5/24/15)

This week we head to the tropical paradise of Hawaii. Things start off on the rooftop of a popular Maui resort that has created a home for 300,000 bees. Then we go below the surface to see a family run sailing company's commitment to clean up local coral reefs. After that it's over to the Garden Island of Kauai chasing down the story about thousands of wild chickens that run free after a hurricane wiped away many of the chicken coups. We finish back on Maui learning about a program designed to help the Hawaiian Green Sea Turtle.

Episode #138 (5/31/15)

This week on Wild About Animals we travel to Vancouver and visit the Marine Mammal Rescue Center. Researcher Bruce McCellan shows us how he uses hair traps to research Grizzly bears. Then we meet up with Rob Hope of O.W.L. who introduces us to a rescued Great Horned Owl that is about to be released into the wild. And finally, we learn about 3 timber wolves, who were raised to be actors, but didn't make it in the acting world and are now running free in Grouse Mountain.

Episode #139 (6/07/15)

This week on Wild About Animals we visit Corolla North Carolina and their beautiful wild Spanish mustangs. We also visit some of these horses that were injured in the wild and are now being tamed by the help of youth in Virginia. Then we stop by Canine Corps to see what they are doing to help troops from Pennsylvania. Lastly homeless teens get a chance to get back on their feet with the help of sheltered animals.

Episode #140 (6/14/15)

This week we travel to the land down under: Australia. Rob Ambrose rescues snakes for a living so we follow him around on a typical day that includes a call from a local high school that spotted a venomous snake living in the building wall. It's Rob's job to get it out. After that we head north to spotlight another risky profession - what it's like to be a crocodile handler in Darwin. And finally, Tasmanian Devils are seeing their population numbers decrease rapidly because of disease. But there is a solution - Devil Ark, where healthy Tasmanian devils live, ensuring the species can survive.

Episode #141 (6/21/15)

This week on Wild About Animals we see how one Giraffe united an entire staff together. We visit primates in Texas, who were raised by humans and now must learn what it means to be a monkey. Then we stop by the Santa Barbara Zoo where one penguin really knows how to accessorize. Finally we follow one couple on their noble journey of dog adoption.

Episode #142 (6/28/15)

This week on Wild About Animals we visit a donkey rescue in Texas and learn about this misunderstood animal. We then head over to New Jersey where a group of dogs is helping service men and women get back to life post-war. Lastly we stop by the town of Punxsutawney and meet their biggest star.
