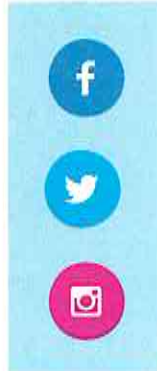

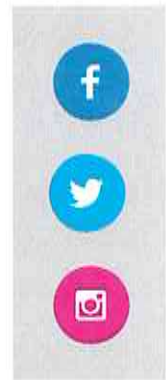

And finally we look at amazing program that spans from the Oregon Zoo to Uganda, Africa teaching kids the importance of wildlife.

Episode #112 (1/29/15)

This week on Wild About Animals...a wild wolf-hybrid is discovered in a local park, and given a new home...we go scuba diving in the Cayman Islands where there's an amazing variety of fish...African Vultures are seen in action during the famous wildebeest migration...and a private sanctuary teaches people how to communicate with farm animals.

Episode #113 (12/06/15)

We start things off in North Carolina visiting a local turtle hospital. Then it's up to Alberta, Canada to see how horses have helped kids that are going through some tough times. Afterwards, the Seattle Aquarium is helping to keep the Giant Pacific Octopus protected around Puget Sound. We wrap up the show in Iowa to see how one refuge plays host to tens of thousands of migrating birds each year.

Episode #114 (12/13/15)

This week go down under to Australia. First up we look at the unique Lumholtz Tree Kangaroo of Queensland. Then we visit a hospital set up to treat and rehabilitate local Queensland frogs. After that we visit thousands of butterflies at the Australia Butterfly Sanctuary. The show wraps up in the Australian Outback learning about a group of volunteers helping to rehabilitate injured wildlife in the Northern Territory.

Episode #115 (12/20/15)

This week on Wild About Animals we head to the Midwest prairie and study it's inhabitants with some students from Iowa State University. We also check out the efforts of the San Diego Zoo's conservation program to save the California Condor.

Episode #116 (12/27/15)

Our show begins in California to learn how zoos and conservation groups have helped the California condor come back from the brink of extinction. From there we head into the Deep Sea with the Monterey Bay Aquarium Research Institute and learn about creatures that survive in the darkest depths. Then we go to Omaha, Nebraska to learn how zoos create balanced nutritional diets for the animals. We finish the show learning how tiny barnacles can impact massive Navy ships around the world.
