The badge can be used to send out basic alerts, such as a crucial medical need, or a more serious call for help.

And checking in repeatedly over time helps you lead them through the valley.

To a betrayed person sometimes people say just forgive and move on. But recovery is a marathon. Establishing a new track record of honesty and faithfulness. Small increases in trust and risk taking. Reconciling a relationship is a marathon. But assuming both parties are running, it can be done and is well worth it.

Stepdads can do this, too, but in the beginning it may look a little different. Smart stepdads cast a godly vision for their home. They take initiative to move the family in that direction, but they recognize that in the beginning, they may need to lead through their wife. She has authority with her kids. She has their trust and she is their source of security not him. He get this, so he provides in direct leadership in the home. Together, with his wife, they set behavioral expectations and standards for the family, but until her kids respect him she is going to be the one following through on consequences. A stepdad who humbly serves his family like this is a smart stepdad indeed.

You do not have a baby so someone will marry you and you do not give a wedding ring so someone will fall in love with you. You fall in love, you commit to a future together and then you give a ring. Let having a baby be about having a baby, not a tool for a family merge.

But then again, sometimes it is safer to be frustrated with safe people. You know, people you know can handle your anger and it will not go anywhere. The point is this: do not scapegoat someone else. Do not take things out on a spouse just because they are standing there or a stepparent just because they are an easy target. Be responsible and talk directly to the person you are frustrated with. That is the only way to make things better.
