

Good morning, I heard on the radio that you were asking for notes of our likes and dislikes. First of all, I enjoy the music, the programs with Senator Brewer, R-Calf, and most anything which contains information regarding the agricultural life.

This things that bother me are when you seem to "bash" things regarding education. I was an educator for 43 years, and one thing I vividly remember was when I was teaching rural schools in Sheridan County. Charles Smith was our County Superintendent, and we were going over test scores. Our scores were generally very high, and he pointed that out, but in the same breath he said, "Don't be patting yourselves on the back." He reminded us that these students were the cream of the crop. They came from families where infidelity was extremely rare (or did not exist at all), every child knew there would be a hot meal served three times a day, there would be enough money to get them through, there was enough love to go around, grandparents were grandparents (not mom and dad substitutes), religion was a real thing, and these kids truly wanted to be proud of what THEY did. He also mentioned that while we were all fine teachers, these kids could do very well with a teacher who wasn't so "fine."

At that time test scores were used entirely to pin point what a child might need extra help in. It was not a report card of how a teacher was doing. We were taught to meet a child where they were, and take them higher. That is what teachers are still doing. I know for a fact that the teachers in our school system are some of the best. There are SO MANY factors that go into learning. My prayer is that instead of being always critical, people would take a minute to ask what they could do to help....and then DO IT.
