Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this guarter:

- A. **Transit and parking:** Oneonta is in a transitional period with parking. A new parking garage is being build and a roundabout has been proposed.
- B. **Politics:** 2023 saw a heated and close race for the county clerk position. The mayor, city admin, and common council were also in focus.
- C. **Arts:** Oneonta is a hotbed for the arts. 2023 saw many different kinds of offerings from plays to musicals to films to arts festivals.
- D. **Fundraising:** Raising funds for local organizations and schools saw much discussion for capital projects, holiday dinners, and school related projects
- E. **Increase of Homelessness and Drug Abuse:** The issue of homelessness is becoming more visible in Oneonta, NY. The Mayor of Oneonta discusses the increase numbers in homelessness and drug abuse.
- F. **Revitalization:** Oneonta has multiple projects either completed or in the works including the demolition of the Ford building and the parking lot that occupies the space now, Main Street facelifts, and new trash bins that run on solar power.
