1/21/2024	:26min	Magdalene House of Austin—Toni McKinley from Magdalene House of Austin joins Inside Austin and host Brian Fitzgerald for a conversation about the work they do with sex trafficking survivors. They also discuss January as Human Trafficking Prevention and Awareness Month and how Magdalene House recently expanded the number of women it can serve.
	:26min	Peak Performers—Peak Performers is a nonprofit staffing agency that helps disabled workers find jobs. Employers often find overlooked but qualified workers. Myles Wallace joins host Brian Fitzgerald on this edition of Inside Austin to discuss how Peak Performers is changing the perception of disability in the workplace.

They talk about her Torch Literary Arts non-profit, which helps Black women writers find their voices and offers a way to access their work to a broader audience. They also discuss the creative process and how the act of doing the work outweighs the need for success or positive feedback.
