### Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Economy:** With the introduction of vaccines and continued mask mandates, we are beginning to see a shed of light at the end of a very dark tunnel that we refer to as 2020. The year-long pandemic has affected the tri-states and U.S. economy in ways we could have never imagined. As business begin to open and people returning to work, we wonder what the post-pandemic economy will look like. Will our communities be able to bounce back or will there be long-term ramifications?
- B. **COVID-19.** One of the biggest impacts of 2020 was the coronavirus (COVID-19) and we are still seeing it's effects into early 2021. With the introduction of vaccines, the numbers for Dubuque and the surrounding area have been slowly decreasing. Deaths from COVID-19 are also declining. Iowa Governor Kim Reynolds held monthly updates with additional mitigation efforts. Those updates were shared with our listeners.
- C. **Education:** During the COVID-19 pandemic, 22% of local children opted for remote learning. As schools begin to open up five days a week, some students may continue to opt for remote learning, while others are eager to get back in the classroom. Students who are returning back to in-person learning however will find the ways teaching has changed this year, including new safety precautions and the use of continued e-learning technology – something they had hoped to take a break from.
- D. **Mental Health:** Many adults in our area have officially hit the one-year mark of working from home – and many are feeling burnt out. Working from home gives off the feeling of constant connectivity to the office. It is estimated that the typical worker receives one email every six minutes, making impossible to feel like you can step away and disconnect. A recent survey reported that roughly 100,000 more Iowans reported feeling depressed nearly every day in December 2020 compared to what was reported in May or even October of last year. The cold weather we experience in the first quarter, coupled with children who are virtual learning and stuck inside, and the constant flow of emails, mental health continues to be a rising issue.

## **Section II. Responsive Programs**

The stations air responsive programming in the form of a weekly 30-minute program, VIEWPOINTS RADIO.

Viewpoints airs each Sunday at 11pm on KLYV (FM), 6:30am on KXGE (FM), 9am on WDBQ (AM), 6am on WDBQ(FM) and 10:30pm on WJOD (FM) See attached program log for details.
