PUBLIC SAFETY

Severe Weather Coverage: <u>WXSS</u> interrupted programming on the following occasions to aid in communicating the threat of severe weather; and reinforcing the need to take shelter for those impacted.

- Thursday, February 8, 2024 A pair of Tornado Warnings encompassing portions of Jefferson County. Also, several Severe Thunderstorm Warnings across our area for large hail potential. A substantial tornado, rated EF2 by the NWS, was ultimately confirmed to have tracked through western Jefferson County.
- Tuesday, February 27, 2024 A Tornado Watch spanning Walworth, Racine, and Kenosha Counties through the afternoon and evening hours. While no severe weather occurred in our area, several tornadoes were reported just south of the Wisconsin-Illinois state line.
- Monday, March 4, 2024 A Tornado Warning for Walworth County; as well as several Severe Thunderstorm Warnings across the southern half of our area-of-responsibility for large hail and severe wind potential.

It is the policy of <u>WXSS</u> to interrupt programming with updates frequently during a severe weather threat (tornado, severe thunderstorm, flash flood, or snow squall warning) within the designated market area. In the event of an extreme threat (gauged by guidance from the National Weather Service), <u>WXSS</u> will suspend all programming and focus solely on the evolving weather situation.

Child Abduction Emergency (Amber Alert): <u>WXSS</u> cut into programming several times on **Tuesday, February 20, 2024** throughout the afternoon and evening to relay a request for help finding a missing 3-year-old boy from Two Rivers, WI (in Manitowoc County).
