Please note that as we are doing our best to adhere to correct social distancing, we have been relayed in putting together this report and uploading this report to the FCC Public File.

As Covid 19 started to take it's grip on our community in March of 2020, KSEY FM AM began to address the issue head. Here is a list of what we have done and in most cases continue to do to keep our community informed.

1) beginning in March we started to broadcast a Covid 19 update on the top of the hour every hour starting on March 20th, Monday thru Friday from 6am till 8pm. We get these daily reports from the Texas State Network.

2) On May 4, 2020 we began to do interviews with Seymour Mayor John Hrnick regarding Covid 19 and what is going on in Seymour. We interview the Mayor the 1st Monday of every month. We have an open door for the Mayor to go on the air anytime he and other local official feel it is warranted.

3) In May and June, Governor Greg Abbott began to have a series of news conference in regards to Covid 19. KSEY AM and FM has broadcast all of the Governor's news conference. We get our audio feed from the Texas State Network.

4) We have and continue to offer free air time to any business an organization to broadcast Covid 19 related news. - ie, events canceled, closings, social distancing, food delivery to those confined at home and ride serves to the hospital and doctors.

2) KSEY broadcast the regular monthly meetings of Seymour City Council for the benefit of the shut-ins and elderly in our community. And now closed meetings, The Meetings are the 3rd thursday of every month. Meeting were broadcast at 7pm on the following dates. 4/16, 5/21 and 6/25.

3) KSEY AM FM broadcast the daily Meals On Wheels menus and other related Meals

On Wheels news. The menus are aired Monday thru Friday at 6:45am, 7:45am, 8:45am, 9:45am, 10:45am and 11:45am.

4) KSEY's EAS encoder-decoder has a telephone interface. The City of Seymour and Baylor County Emergency Management has access to the system to immediately broadcast local emergencies.

5) KSEY has determined that the danger of wildfires is a real issue because of extremely dry conditions and little rain. We broadcast 50 fire danger announcements per week thru this quarter. The announcements were at the request of Baylor County Judge Linda Rogers.

6) Rabies is always a problem in Baylor County in late spring/early summer. In the month of June, we broadcast 100 rabies safety announcements and promoted low cost rabies clinics that are offered thru the city of Seymour.

7) Economic development in rural Texas is a serious issue facing Baylor county. And particularly now with Covid 19, KSEY AM FM broadcast 100 :30 announcements in June promoting economic development and programs offered thru the Seymour Chamber of Commerce aimed at creating jobs.

8) KSEY AM FM broadcast a show called THIS WEEK IN TEXAS that is produced by the Texas State Network every Sunday Morning at 5:05 am. This show explores all issues concerning Texas. A rundown of all topics and dates are available thru TSN.
