ISSUES OF CONCERN TO KDWN
ADDRESSED IN RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING IN THE
4th QUARTER of 2013

1. HEALTH: Discussion lingers over the impact of new national health care legislation on the state level. The effects of air pollution and smoking on health are underscored in a new survey
2. HOUSING: Nevada's housing market is getting better, but is a new bubble on the way? Housing prices are rising but buyers are investors paying in cash and shutting first time buyers out of the market.
3. ECONOMY: Nevada's unemployment rate continues to be a drain on the economy as a whole.
4. ENERGY: Renewable energy is touted as a way to save on costs as well as its benefits in bringing new jobs to Nevada. But is solar ever going to take off in the sunniest place in the nation?
5. CRIME/SAFETY: Drugs and gang problems are the root of many crime concerns in Southern Nevada. A focus remains on the use of deadly force by law enforcement.
6. EDUCATION: Nevada looks to improve its results in K-12 education while having its higher education system help increase employment opportunities in Nevada. Improvements, however, are not being seen in testing.
7. TAXES: State and local governments cope with deficits during a sluggish economy with the realization these concerns will carry over into the next year. And some new taxes are hitting residents in the new year.
8. TRANSPORTATION: Ways to improve transit throughout the Las Vegas valley are high on the agenda for local transportation agencies. There's renewed talk about extending the monorail to the airport.
9. COMMUNITY: The discussion of race and ethnicity is in the spotlight as Nevadans look for a way to achieve harmony and best address the needs of a minority population. Immigration reform is discussed.

10. FAMILY: Abuse of children and the elderly is addressed. Also the foster care system in Clark County has come under fire.
