Aired 8am to 8:30am and 10:30am to 11am

30-minute program

Issues Covered: Domestic Violence, Economic Issues, Drugs and Alcohol and Community Involvement.

Guest: Paige Flink the CEO of The Family Place

Topic: The Coronavirus pandemic has resulted in stay at home orders across the country and unfortunately these orders that are meant to keep us all safe from a deadly virus have also created a perfect powder keg situation for people who are living in homes with an abuser. Paige Flink the CEO of The Family Place the leader in family violence prevention in North Texas joined me to talk about how the coronavirus pandemic and stay at home orders have led to an increase in the number of victims of abuse at area hospitals. We talked about ways that women and men can get help and we also talked about the need for neighbors and family members to stay in touch with loved ones so that if they are being abused that they can intervene and help them out. We also talked about the services and programs that The Family Place offers and how the coronavirus has impacted the way they do their job with virtual counseling sessions and increased cleanings at the shelter and new clients to the shelter being placed in separate hotels for 14 days to make sure they are not infected to protect staff and other clients and their children. Family violence and child abuse calls may be decreasing because there is no safe way to reach out to authorities but hospital visits are on the rise which means the victims of abuse are at more risk during stay at home orders and we want to make sure that we are providing information to those who need it.

April 12, 2020

Issues Covered: Economic Issues, Coronavirus Pandemic, Education and Community Involvement

Guests: Susan Hoff with United Way of Metropolitan Dallas and Monica Egert with Communities Foundation of Texas

Topic: As the Coronavirus Pandemic continues to sweep across our country more and more businesses are laying off workers and the economic impact is hitting North Texas families and agencies especially hard. Susan Hoff with United Way joined me to talk about United Ways Coronavirus Economic Response Plan and the resources that they have available to help families from information on businesses that are hiring to information on navigating the unemployment benefits process at a time when the wait for benefits is at an all time high due to the number of people filing for unemployment. We also talked about the mental health resources that they have to help people dealing with the stress of the situation we are living in and the number of agencies that are here in our area that can help people in need from food banks to other social service agencies. Monica Egert with Communities Foundation of Texas joined me to talk about the upcoming North Texas Giving Tuesday Now a fundraising effort that is taking place between April 14th and May 6th to help out area nonprofits who are being stretched to the limit because of the increase in demand for their services during the Coronavirus Pandemic. We also talked about how Communities Foundation of Texas and United Way are working with community leaders, faith leaders, educators and school districts and nonprofits to come up with best practices to help people during the pandemic. May 6th will be North Texas Giving Tuesday Now and we promoted ways to give and the importance of giving at this time to lift up our community and our neighbors.

Issues Covered: Coronavirus Pandemic, Health Issues, Pregnancy and Coronavirus and Medical Research

Guests: Stacy Stewart the President of the March of Dimes and Dr. Nicole Morris PHD

Topic: The March for Babies benefitting the March of Dimes should have taken place yesterday in Fort Worth but because of the coronavirus pandemic the event was canceled and so was the upcoming march in Dallas and instead of the March of Dimes is having a virtual Mother's Day March for Babies on May 10th. Stacy Stewart with the March of Dimes and Dr. Nicole Morris PHD joined me on the phone to talk about how the coronavirus pandemic is affecting pregnant women and how since it is such a new virus more research needs to be done to make sure that mothers and babies are safe. We talked about what women who are thinking of using the stay at home time to get pregnant should know to make sure they have a safe and healthy pregnancy and Dr. Morris, who along with her husband and son, is the Ambassador for this year's Dallas March for Babies shared her own personal journey of having a normal pregnancy until she went in to early labor and had a premature baby boy and how her son was hospitalized for months but thanks to the medications that were discovered thanks to the research done by the March of Dimes her son is with us today. Stacy Stewart talked about how it was during the polio pandemic that the March of Dimes was created and how the work that they did at that time led to the polio vaccine so the research being done now to find a coronavirus vaccine is extremely important.

April 19, 2020

Issues Covered: Coronavirus Pandemic Economic Impact, Fraud and Scammers.

Guest: Amy Razor with the Better Business Bureau

Topic: The Coronavirus Pandemic has unfortunately led to a whole slew of charity scams and other types of fraud and Amy Razor with the Better Business Bureau joined me to talk about the different types of scams that are currently out there from fake medical breakthroughs to fake charities that are set up to steal people's money and there is also a scam to cheat people out of their stimulus funds. Amy shared tips on how to know if it is a scam or the real deal and she talked about the work that the Better Business Bureau does to safeguard consumers by accrediting businesses who are working in the public's interest. We talked about the BBB website which can help students and the military so that they do not become the victims of education scams and we talked about how people can go to the website to check out the charity navigator so that you feel confident that the money that you are donating is going to a trustworthy nonprofit.

April 26, 2020

Issues Covered: The US Census and Economic Issues and the Impact of the Coronavirus Pandemic

Guests: Sophia Johnson with the US Census marketing team in Dallas and Todd Mark with Friends of Consumer Freedom and Jennifer Ingram with SMB Marketing for Spectrum Business

Topic: The US Census is now underway but due to the coronavirus pandemic field operations have been canceled to keep people safe. Sophia Johnson joined me to talk about the importance of filling out the census and how the information that is gathered will determine where federal funds will go for housing, transportation, education, healthcare and for other social services. We talked about how people can fill out the census we talked about misconceptions about citizenship and who should fill out a census and we also talked about how the deadline has been extended to the end of October as a result of the coronavirus. The Economic Impact of the Coronavirus Pandemic has left so many North Texas families in need and struggling to make ends meet. Todd Mark with Friends of Consumer Freedom a nonprofit that helps people with their finances and with credit issues and housing issues joined me to talk about ways that people can navigate this difficult economic time by planning for the future and by budgeting for lean times. We talked about ways to avoid default and how to reach out to agencies to make sure that you get rent or mortgage relief or even help with your car payments during this time and we talked about the importance of educating yourself so that you feel like you have some sort of control over your finances and don't end up in a bad mental state. Todd talked about the webinars that they are having to help people that are free of charge. Jennifer Ingram with Spectrum Business joined me to talk about what they are doing to help businesses who have had to switch from working from their offices to home and how they are offering up free services to make sure small businesses stay afloat and navigate the new normal. Jennifer also talked about how they are helping students who don't have internet access and the work that they are doing to make sure that no student is left behind as a result of online learning.

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues during Coronavirus Pandemic, Hoarding and Community Involvement and Economic Issues.

Guest: Bonnie Cook the Executive Director of Mental Health America of Greater

Topic: May is Mental Health Awareness Month and Bonnie Cook joined me to talk about the importance of people talking about their mental health issues and the importance of knowing that there are resources available to anyone struggling with depression, schizophrenia, bi-polar disorder or a multitude of other mental health issues and that their loved ones know that there are resources for them as well especially during this time when people are under additional stress as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic. Bonnie talked about the programs that Mental Health America of Greater Dallas offers to people in our area including the We Help Ourselves program targeted at youth and programs for senior citizens with programs going virtual to keep social distancing guidelines in place but she also talked about social distancing does not mean emotional distancing and how people need to stay connected to protect their mental health.. We also talked about the upcoming hoarding conference being held virtually this year and what people who are dealing with a hoarder need to know about the issue. We talked about signs that people need to be on the lookout for during this time that they may need help to deal with sadness and stress caused by our new normal in the age of coronavirus.

Guest: Dr. Durado Brooks with the American Cancer Society

Topic: With the focus on the coronavirus a lot of people undergoing cancer treatment have had to put treatment on hold to make sure that hospitals can deal with the patients who are Covid positive. Dr. Brooks joined me to talk about the work that the American Cancer Society is doing to help cancer patients and their families and how they have gone virtual with their programs and with telehealth warning patients to go to the hospital if they need to because hospitals and doctors are taking the necessary precautions to protect patients. We talked about signs and symptoms people should be on the lookout for and we talked about the current work being done to find cures and therapies for breast cancer, colon cancer, prostate cancer, etc.

Issues Covered: Economic Issues, Hospitality Industry, Children and Families in need.

Guests: Allison Mattis co-founder of Staff Meal and Barbara Johnson the CEO of Hope Supply Company

Topic: Of all the industries impacted by the Coronavirus Pandemic the hospitality industry which includes hotels, restaurants and bars has been especially hit hard with those who work in the industry finding themselves unemployed. Allison Mattis joined me to talk about the new nonprofit that she co-founded that feeds those in the hospitality industry every Saturday with meals for the week so that those who are unemployed can put food on the table for themselves and their families. Allison talked about the need for this service especially since food banks in our area are being stretched to the limit and since Allison and her partners are in the restaurant business, they teamed up with chefs to prepare meals that are comfort food for the soul. She talked about ways that the community can help and also who can get help. Barbara Johnson the CEO of Hope Supply Company joined me on this Mother's Day to talk about the desperate need for diapers and baby supplies for people who are in need as a result of what is happening in the world right now with the demand for diapers and baby supplies tripling between March and May as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic. Barbara talked about the work that Hope Supply does to help agencies that help homeless children in North Texas and we talked about ways in which the community can help.

Guest: Charmaine Solomon the founder of My Possibilities

Topic: On this Mother's Day I wanted to highlight an amazing mom who along with two other mothers began the nonprofit My Possibilities to help adults with special needs when the moms discovered that there were no programs for their children when they graduated from high school. Charmaine Solomon joined me on the phone to talk about the work that My Possibilities does and how they have adapted their programs to go virtual so that their clients can stay connected to the programs that teach them self-sufficiency. We talked about their foster care and adoption programs and Elizabeth talked about educational classes for fostering and adopting and we talked about ways the community can help Jonathan's Place throughout the year.

One of the beneficiaries of this year's Carry the Load March is the nonprofit 22 Kill. Jacob Schick is the Executive Director of the nonprofit 22 Kill and he joined me to talk about how his agency is helping with the mental health needs of our veterans which are now being impacted by the effects of stay at home orders. 22 Kill was started as a result of the alarming number of suicides amongst our veterans with national statistics showing that on average every day 22 veterans take their own life. 22 Kill raises awareness about the suicide epidemic plaguing our country's veterans and offers support programs that provide services to our vets so that they can overcome depression and anxiety. Jacob shared his own personal journey. He was severely injured in Iraq and lost his leg to combat but it was the invisible wounds of battle that almost cost him his life and that is why he is committed to helping those who are dealing with suicidal thoughts. We also let people know that if they are in crisis that there is help and how 22 Kill can be a resource for those veterans who feel hopeless.

We talked about misconceptions about giving blood and who is eligible to donate and how many people are impacted by one donation since blood is used for burn patients, patients undergoing chemotherapy and victims of car accidents or gunshots.

Jerry Hawkins joined me to have a conversation about racism in America and to talk about the work that Dallas Truth, Racial Healing and Transformation does in our area as an anti-racist nonprofit in North Texas. We talked about what people of color are feeling at this time and how the coronavirus pandemic and its economic impact made the situation a perfect storm for tensions to come to a head and for people to take to the streets to call for justice for George Floyd and for all people of color who have been killed by police for seemingly inconsequential crimes. We talked about defunding police and bridging the gap between police and the communities they serve and how the nonprofit works with city leaders, state leaders, faith leaders and community activists to find a way forward to a more perfect union where racism is faced head on.
