July 3, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am

30 minute program

Issues: Veterans Support, Mental Health, Economy and Gun Ownership Rights and Responsibility.

Guests: Joe Jenkins and Vance Keyes, US Marine Veterans who work with Vets For The People.

Topic: It is 4th of July weekend and as we celebrate our nation's birthday and the freedom that we all enjoy thanks to living in this country and thanks to our military we wanted to highlight a nonprofit that helps our nation's veterans by advocating for them to get better health care and better jobs as well as encourages veterans to get involved in their communities. Joe Jenkins and Vance Keyes are both US Marine veterans who work with the nonprofit Vets For The People and they talked about the work that they do to help veterans and the goals of the organization to make sure that no soldier is left behind economically or health wise. We also talked about issues that veterans should be speaking up about including gun control. Both Joe and Vance talked about how in the military you go through extensive training and you go through psychological tests before you can even handle a gun and how these same rules should apply to all Americans. Joe and Vance are firm believers that military veterans can change the narrative around issues that our nation faces and be a unifying voice in society.

July 10, 2022

Aired 10am to 10:30am

30 minute program

Issues: Education and the Economy and Health Issues

Guest: Florencia Velasco Fortner the President and CEO of The Concilio.

Topic: With inflation at a 40 year high across the country more and more of our local nonprofits are seeing a spike in the number of people that they are helping and it is very apparent in our minority communities. FlorenicaVelasco Fortner joined me to talk about the work that The Concilio is doing to help Hispanic families in North Texas. The Concilio is a nonprofit whose mission is to build stronger communities by unlocking opportunities for Latino families and other minority families who are at risk economically. The Concilio help with health programs, financial stability and crisis intervention and with cultural competency education and training as well as tech training to help families who may not be computer savvy. They also help families navigate the school system with program that encourage parents to get involved in their child's education starting in pre-k. We also talked about how The Concilio will celebrate their 40th Anniversary this year with a benefit gala that will highlight the work that they do and the impact that they are making in the community and we outlined the nonprofit's goals for the future to lift up the people that they serve so that they can provide a better life for themselves and for their children.

July 17, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am

30 minute program

Issues: Education and Economic Issues and Child Welfare Issues

Guests: Tanya Quiambao the Associate Communications Manager of Corporate Affairs for Kroger North Texas and Crystal Scanio the CEO of the Irving Schools Foundation and Kathleen LaValle the President and CEO of Dallas CASA. Topic: We are just a month away from students in North Texas going back to school and as families get ready to send kids back to school we are once again teaming up for the Backpack Boosters Back to School Supply Drive and at a time when so many families are struggling due to inflation and high gas prices the need for back to school supplies is greater this year than it was even last year. Crystal Schanio with the Irving Independent School District and Tanya Quiambao with Kroger joined me to talk about how this year's Back to School Supply Drive will work and how easy it is to make donation at any Kroger in North Texas when you check out. You can either by a supply kit or make a donation of any dollar amount. The goal this year is to help over 78 thousand students in ten school districts. Crystal talked about the importance of helping kids who may not be able to afford back to school supplies because their families are already barely making it month to month with rent, car insurance and buying groceries due to the high cost of food and how fuel prices are taking a bigger chunk out of their budgets. She talked about the reality of what faces children today in low income zip codes and how these school supplies help the children focus on their education rather than their need. Tanya talked about outreach efforts by Kroger to help schools in North Texas and how communities and neighborhoods need to do their part to volunteer to help out their area school districts. Kathleen La Valle with Dallas CASA joined me for the second part of the program to talk about the Parade of Playhouses at North Park Center in Dallas which will benefit Dallas CASA and their work to help abused and neglected children in North Texas. Kathleen talked about the need for volunteers to become advocates and the impact that these volunteers have on the lives of children who are abused and

neglected. .

July 24, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am

30 minute program

Issues: Health Issues, Monkeypox, Covid 19 HIV and AIDS and Education and Economic Issues Guest: Dr. John Carlo the Executive Director of Prism Health North Texas.

Topic: Dallas and Tarrant Counties are seeing their first cases of Monkeypox and Dr. Carlo joined me to talk about this latest threat to public health and what people should know about the disease and how to protect themselves. Currently health officials

are seeing Monkeypox among the LGBTQ plus community and as the head of a nonprofit that serves the LGBTQ plus community Dr. Carlo talked about what they are doing to inform people. Dr. Carlo also talked about the latest Covid strain and his fear that people are becoming complacent and not getting booster shots. We also talked about HIV and AIDS cases in North Texas and the services and programs that Prism Health provides including testing and mental health resources as well as a food pantry, transportation and healthcare navigation. Dr. Carlo also talked about the summer of Lifewalk which raises awareness about HIV and AIDS and raises funds for the programs offered by Prism Health. We also talked about research in to cures and a possible vaccine for HIV and AIDS and how the research that is currently going on can also help lead to cures for other illnesses.

July 31, 2022

Aired 10am to 10:30am

30 minute program

Issues: Education Issues and Emergency Disaster Assistance

Guests: Jake Kurz the Director of Communications for Responsive Ed a nonprofit organization operating more than 80 tuition free public schools in Texas and Arkansas and Teresa Jackson the Executive Director of Sharing Life.

Topic: With North Texas Schools set to resume classes in two weeks Jake Kurz joined me to talk about education issues. How parents and students should prepare for back to school so that they are ready to learn on day one. We talked about the Covid learning slide that has impacted reading and math scores and how parents and students can take steps to get back on track. Jake talked about the work that Responsive Ed does to help students who learn differently responding to the needs of individual students who may be struggling or who may want to accelerate their learning to graduate early or perhaps try a technical career path rather than a typical liberal arts path. Jake talked about how education is not one size fits all and the results that they see and the feedback that they receive from parents and students who struggled in other schools but who are thriving in the Responsive Ed environment. Teresa Jackson with Sharing Life joined me to talk about the grass fire that spread in the Balch Springs area causing an estimated 6 million dollars in damages with homeowners losing their homes and vehicles due to the grass fire. Sharing Life was on hand immediately to help those who lost so much, finding shelter and helping them with clothing and other necessities. Teresa talked about the work that Sharing Life does year round not just during disasters in the Mesquite and Balch Springs area from their food pantry to homeless assistance to help for senior citizens and education programs for children and for adults looking to get their GED.

August 7, 2022

Aired 10am to 10:30am

30 minute program

Issues: Health Issues, Mental Health, Education

Guests: Jim Newton the Founder of KidLinks and Sara Chigani a board certified music therapist.

Topic: As children return to school some may encounter difficulties adjusting to being back in school and may face some emotional hurdles and some students may be facing health issues and have been hospitalized. The nonprofit Kidlinks is committed to linking kids to healing, hope and happiness thru music and media. Jim Newton and Sara Chigani joined me to talk about the programs that Kidlinks offers to hospitals and schools as well as to parents who can go online and find music therapy programs for free that can help children with all sorts of issues from bullying to insecurity to anger and sadness. Jim and Sara talked about the impact that music therapy and therapeutic music entertainment has on children and the feedback that they get from parents. We also talked about the upcoming free Hugapalooza which will highlight the work that Kidlinks does. The event will be held August 20th at the Rosewood Center for Family Arts Studio in Dallas.

August 14, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program Issues: Education and Economy Guest: Kimberly Benavides the Executive Director of Reading Partners North Texas. Topic: The school year has started and many education experts remain concerned about the covid learning slide caused by the pandemic. Kimberly joined me to talk about the work that Reading Partners is doing in schools across North Texas to help students who are struggling to read. Their focus is on children K thru 3rd grade and getting them to reading level because studies have shown that after the 3rd grade if a child is not able to read at class level they struggle for the rest of their time in school and may drop out. Reading Partners provides one on one tutoring and also online tutoring and currently they are in need of volunteers to help. Kimberly talked about the impact that they are having in the schools where they are located and she talked about how other schools can take part

August 21, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program Issues: Mental Health Issues and Education Guest: Sonya Parker Goode the Director of Outreach and Education for the Grant Halliburton Foundation.

Topic: As classes resume at North Texas schools teachers and counselors are worried about their students mental health and one of the premiere nonprofits that deals with youth mental health is the Grant Halliburton Foundation and Sonya Parker Goode from the foundation joined me to talk about what parents and educators need to know about mental health issues and what students may be facing in the new year after dealing with the pandemic and its aftermath. Sonya talked about the education programs that the Grant Halliburton has for school districts here in North Texas and we talked about the Hope Squad which enlists other students to help those students who are at risk thru a peer to peer program. We talked about the rise in suicide rates among young people and ways that the community can help prevent suicide by raising awareness and letting people know that there is help. We also talked about the upcoming When Life Hands you Teenagers Educational Conference which is aimed at anyone who works or lives with teens. The event will be help in person and virtually on September 21st.

August 28, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am

30 minute program

Issues: Community Involvement, Mental Health Issues and Education and Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention. Guests: Calah Kelly with Volunteer Now, Beth Wilson with Drug Prevention Resources and Amanda Esquivel a licensed therapist.

Topic: As we approach yet another anniversary of the 9/11 attacks, I wanted to highlight the fact that September 11th is a National Day of Service aimed at honoring those who lost their lives on September 11, 2001 by giving of your time and talents to your community. Calah talked about 9/11 Day and also talked about the upcoming Voly in the Park at Klyde Warren Park in Dallas which will highlight volunteer opportunities in North Texas year-round. Hundreds of nonprofits will be on hand at Voly in the Park and will have hands on demonstrations as well as entertainment making this event a fun family outing. The month of September is Recovery Month and Beth and Amanda joined me to talk about the upcoming mental health fair that will take place in Garland that will raise awareness about Alcohol and Drug Abuse prevention resources as well as mental health resources. So many young people and adults who are dealing with drug and alcohol abuse are often times dealing with a dual diagnosis of depression. Beth talked about her own personal struggles with drugs and alcohol and how she finally hit rock bottom and thanks to the help of family and friends was able to become sober and has been sober for 30 years. Beth talked about what those who are struggling should know and what their loved ones can do to help them, and Amanda talked about the steps that people can take to get on the road to recovery. We also talked about mental health issues facing today's youth and how the economy, the pandemic, social isolation has created a perfect storm for people to struggle. We also promoted the new mental health crisis line where people can call 988 for suicide prevention and crisis services.

September 4, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program Issues: Economic Issues and Housing and Education Guest: Wayne Walker the founder and CEO of Our Calling a nonprofit that helps the homeless in North Texas. Topic: Home prices and the cost of rent continue to rise across our country and homeless advocates here in North Texas are saying that we are seeing an increase in the homeless population, and it is not just people on the streets or in shelters but those who are staying with loved ones or friends because they lost their home. Wayne Walker the founder of Our Calling the nonpro

who are staying with loved ones or friends because they lost their home. Wayne Walker the founder of Our Calling the nonprofit that helps the homeless in North Texas joined me to talk about the new faces among the homeless population, how he started the nonprofit and what he wished more people knew about those who are on the streets or who are in shelters and the help that they need to be able to get back on their feet. We talked about the programs that Our Calling offers that provide more than just a bed and a meal and how they work with other nonprofits to provide job training, education programs, and other resources. We also talked about Our Calling's plan to raise 50 million dollars to build the largest tiny house community here in North Texas to help the most vulnerable in the homeless community.

September 11, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program Issues: Health Issue and Community Involvement

Guest: Tate Cruse the co-founder of Team Connor Pediatric Cancer Research Foundation

Topic: As we mark yet another anniversary of the 9/11 attacks I highlighted the volunteer opportunities that people can commit to for today's National Day of Service and promoted the upcoming North Texas Giving Day which will help raise funds for our area nonprofits with donations being doubled by Communities Foundation of North Texas. The month of September is Pediatric Cancer Awareness month and so today we highlighted the work that the Team Connor Pediatric Cancer Research Foundation is doing to raise awareness and funds for research. The foundation was started by Tate and his wife as a way of honoring their son Tate who battled stage four neuroblastoma until he died at the age of 8 in 2009. Tate shared Connor's story and how he and his wife were committed to helping to find a cure for pediatric cancer and to find better treatments. He talked about the impact that their fundraising has had on helping research projects around the country focused on pediatric cancer and the breakthroughs that he has seen in the last 13 years since Tate passed away.

September 18. 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues: Education, Economic Issues and Community Involvement.

Guest: Karissa Condoiannis the Senior Vice President of Public Relations for the State Fair of Texas

Topic: The State Fair of Texas gets underway September 30th thru October 23rd and Karissa Condoiannis with the State Fair of Texas joined me to talk about the event which has been a Texas tradition since 1886 and which gives back to our community with scholarship programs and with food drives. Karissa talked about the impact on our local economy and what people can expect this year and we also highlighted the community work that the State Fair of Texas does from the Big Tex Urban Farms that provide fresh produce to people living around Fair Park and we talked about their education programs which during the pandemic went virtual and were such a success that they are still offering virtual education courses for people to learn about agriculture and more. We talked about the annual State Fair food drive that collects food for the North Texas food drive during the fair.

September 25, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program Issues: Health Issue Guest: Corena Mitchell with Attitudes and Attire

Topic: With gas and food prices cutting into people's budgets more and more North Texas nonprofits are experiencing an increase in the number of people needing assistance Among the many organizations helping people get back on their feet is Attitudes and Attire a nonprofit that helps women who are seeing self-sufficiency with programs focused on job training, interview skills, financial literacy and also providing women who often times hit hard times because of domestic violence, drug abuse, homelessness or because they were victims of human trafficking with mental health resources and dental procedures. Corena Mitchell joined me to talk about the work that they are doing and to promote one of their biggest fundraisers the annual Attitudes and Attire Fashion Show and Luncheon which will be held on October 14th in Dallas. Corena who is an army veteran heads up the Boots to Heels program which helps female veterans who have faced difficulties due to PTS or due to depression on returning to a new normal and not knowing how to adjust to civilian life. Corena spoke of her own struggles when she left the army and how she considered suicide but was helped by Attitudes and Attire herself and after going thru the program she believed so much in the work that the nonprofit is doing that she volunteered and later became the director of the Boots to Heels program.

Kozo reinforced the critical importance of developing a home escape plan with all members of the household and practicing it regularly. He incorporated information about Kidde's 'smart' resources into the conversation.
- **Michael Capponi, Founder/President Global Empowerment Mission.** Capponi discussed how Global Empowerment is assisting with disaster aid throughout the Southeast following the destruction of Hurricane Ian. Global Empowerment Mission is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization founded in 2011 as a first responder to global disasters. Capponi also talked about GEM'S recent missions in the Ukraine.

- Scott Strode, Founder and National Executive Director of The Phoenix. Addiction recovery is an issue that impacts nearly half of Americans. One Million Strong is an organization uniting fans, artists, and the music industry to destigmatize addiction recovery through the power of community. Strode talked about his personal journey with addiction recovery and their mission to build a national sober active community that fuels resilience and harnesses transformation.
- Lea Crager Director of FEMA's Ready Campaign Preparing for Natural Disasters & Emergencies. September is National Preparedness Month. Crager talked about how Americans can stay prepared for emergencies and disasters, such as hurricanes, wildfires, flooding and more. He focused on the importance of knowing the risks of where you live and having a plan in place to your family safe, no matter the conditions.

Bearman focused on the continued challenges facing Hispanic communities with dispensing updated COVID health information.
- Brian DiSabatino, Creator of Virtual Veteran Festival and Jenny Siler, Veteran Spouse and Director of Corporate Sponsorships at Stop Soldier Suicide. The mission of Vet Fest is to provide an uplifting and educational day, bringing the military and civilian communities together to benefit our active duty and military families. DiSabitino and Siler talked about the event and stressed the importance of peer-to-peer networking, mental health, and gratitude for active service members and vets.

• Dr. Evelyn Twentyman, Medical Epidemiologist with the CDC Division of Reproductive Health. The new Omicron-boosters are being delivered but what do we need to know about the updated COVID vaccines? Tobin told us how they are different from the previous vaccines, and how they will they better protect us against the variants that are currently circulating. She also discussed booster availability, safety, and health equity.
