October 2.2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am

30 minute program

Issues Covered: Human Trafficking, Economic Issues and Education and Safety

Guests: Bianca Davis the CEO of New Friends New Life

Topic: Last week in Plano police discovered a brothel in a residential neighborhood that was operating in a short term rental home on Las Palmas Lane and the women living and working in the home were all being trafficked allegedly by 41 year old Brandy Cliff and 22 year old Madison Hatcher. The arrests highlight the fact that sex trafficking can happen anywhere in our area and people need to be vigilant. Bianca Davis the CEO of New Friends New Life, a North Texas nonprofit that helps raise awareness about the issue of sex trafficking and helps the victims of human trafficking with services and programs that can help them get back on their feet, joined me to talk about what people should be on the lookout for if the come across someone who they fear may be trafficked. We also talked about the services and programs that they have to help victims from education

programs to job training, financial assistance, mental health and spiritual support. The nonprofit also does educational outreach to inform the public of risks to young women and young men. We talked about their upcoming luncheon on November 4th at the Hyatt Regency in Dallas that will help raise money for the nonprofit. The event will feature Julia Ormond the star of Legends of the Fall and Sabrina is also a Goodwill Ambassador against Trafficking and Slavery.

October 9, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues, Homelessness, Housing and Education

Guests: Teresa Thomas the Director of Advancement Communications at Austin Street Center.

Topic: The number of people who are considered homeless has risen dramatically in North Texas and across the country due to the pandemic and its impact on the economy. Teresa joined me to talk about the work that Austin Street Center is doing to tackle the issue of homelessness in North Texas. And to help those who find themselves among the homeless or unhoused population. We talked about the recent legislation to get homeless people from making encampments under overpasses or in vacant lots and what people should know about making homelessness a crime versus tackling the issue head on and finding a more humane fix. Teresa also talked about their upcoming Humble Beginnings Luncheon that will feature former First Lady Laura Bush and her daughter Barbara Bush.

October 16, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Child Abuse Prevention and HIV and Aids Prevention and LGBTQ rights.

Guest: Lynn McLean the CEO of Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County

Topic: Lynn McLean the CEO of the Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County joined me to talk about the upcoming Teddy Bear Ride that will benefit the Children's Advocacy Center and their work with abused and neglected kids in Collin County. The ride will take place on Sunday, October 23rd and riders will be able to attend in person and virtually. The event raises awareness and funds for the Advocacy Center. Lynn talked about the impact that the ongoing pandemic has had on the number of children being abused because whenever there are economic problems ina household abuse goes up. Lynn also talked about what we can do to make sure we are checking up on children and she talked about the work that the Advocacy Center does to help children and their families. We also talked about the signs that people should be on the lookout for if they fear a child is being abused and how to report. Currently it is estimated that every ten seconds there is a report of child abuse in the US and most of the time the child knows their abuser and Lynn says that for every adult educated on child abuse at least ten children are made safer.

October 23, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Crime Prevention, Economic Issues, and Domestic Violence Awareness

Guest: Mimi Crume Sterling the Executive Director of the Family Place .

Topic: October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and Mimi joined me to talk about what we should all know about family violence including the signs to be on the lookout for and the impact that this problem has on families and on our community. Mimi, talked about the work that the Family Place does to raise awareness about the issue of domestic violence but also to help the victims and their families. We talked about safety planning; the abuse hotline and ways to help those who are being abused. We also talked about the Partners Card campaign which will raise funds for the Family Place's services and programs including their transitional living and emergency shelters. We also talked about the increase in dating violence among youth and the need for parents to understand that young women

Issues Covered: Economic issues and Education

Guest: Josh Franzen the Senior Community and Business Development Representative with In Touch Credit Union

Topic: Tomorrow is World Savings Day which is aimed at promoting saving money and raising awareness on the important role that savings has a on a family's peace of mind. Josh Franzen joined me to talk about financial literacy education programs and he offered up tips on building up an emergency savings plan. We talked about best practices for getting out of debt, advice for young people hoping to build a savings for a home in the future or paying off their student loan debt, or planning a wedding. We also talked about holiday shopping and how to best stretch your dollar during the holidays so that you aren't paying off credit card statements for six months after Christmas.

November 6, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Community Involvement, Education, Child Abuse Prevention

Guests: Cindy Large one of the co-chairs of this year's Chi Omega Christmas Market and Kathleen LaValle the President and CEO of Dallas CASA

Topic: Holiday shopping with a purpose by giving back to your community is the goal of the Chi Omega Christmas Market. The annual event, now in its 45^{th} year, features merchants selling everything from clothes to home décor to food items and the money raised benefits numerous North Texas charities. Cindy joined me to talk about this year's Chi Omega Christmas Market which will be both in person and virtual. We talked about the impact the market has on the charities that are selected every year to be beneficiaries and we also talked about the selection process for charities who may want to be included next year. This year's beneficiaries include Make A Wish, Dallas Children's Theater, Exodus Ministries, Girl Scouts of North East Texas, The Warren Center and Dallas CASA just to name a few. For the second half of the program I was joined by Kathleen LaValle with Dallas CASA who talked about the impact that the money raised from the Chi Omega Christmas Market has on their nonprofit and how they plan on investing the money raised into their programs aimed at helping children who have been abused or neglected in North Texas. Kathleen also talked about the ongoing need for CASA volunteers, the training process which can now be done virtually and the impact that their volunteers have on the lives of the children that CASA serves.

November 13, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Veterans Issues and Mental Health Issues and Economic Issues

Guest: Terri Stringer the Assistant Executive Director of Patriot Paws Service Dogs.

Topic: It is Veteran's Day weekend and we highlighted Patriot Paws Service Dogs for their work in helping veterans who need a service dog because of physical injuries suffered in battle or because of PTS. Terri Stringer joined me to talk about the history of Patriot Paws which was founded following the conflict in Afghanistan to help those men and women who were having difficulty after serving our country, We talked about the programs that they have in place to train dogs and to place dogs, who can qualify for a service dog, and the impact that the free service dogs have on the lives of the people who receive them. Terri talked about the prison program where dogs are trained at federal prisons by inmates who have been deemed eligible to become a dog trainer and we talked about their puppy raiser program where an individual who live and work with a service dog in their homes and at work to get the dogs acclimated to real world scenarios.

November 20, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economic Issues and Health Issues

Guest: Jill Cumnock the CEO of the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas

Topic: Jill Cumnock with the Ronald McDonald House of Dallas joined me to talk about the Trains at North Park which benefits the Ronald McDonald House. The Trains at North Park are up and running through January 3rd and Jill talked about what people can expect this year. Jill also talked about the work that the Ronald McDonald House does as a home away from home for families who have a child being treated at one of our many children's hospitals and how the house is able to economically help those families who are already spending so much money on their child's healthcare. We talked about how the house adapted to the pandemic and how they still follow CDC guidelines since many of the people who come to the home have imuno compromised systems or since they go to the hospital every day to be with a loved one they have to protect themselves from the flue and covid so as not to endanger their loved one and others. We talked about the scholarship program they have set up for children who have spent time at the Ronald McDonald House and their siblings so that they can go to college and we talked about the many volunteer opportunities and the ways that the community can help.

November 27, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Health Issue and Mental Health and Organ Donation Guest: Tara Storch the co-founder of Taylor's Gift Foundation

Topic: Today we talked about the gift of life and the importance of registering to become an organ donor. Tara Storch the cofounder along with her husband Todd of Taylor's Gift joined me to talk about their Foundation and the history behind it. Taylor's Gift Foundation is named after Taylor Storch who died in a tragic ski accident in March of 2010. Her organs were donated and the family's journey thru grief led them to create Taylor's Gift as a way to help other families. The foundation raises awareness about the need for more people to register to become organ donors and how one donation can save so many people who are currently waiting for a lifesaving organ transplant. We talked about the people who were saved because of Taylor's donation and how the family has met some of the people who received her organs and we also talked about the work that they do to help families like theirs who are donor families. Those families have lost a loved one and who decided to donate their organs. They offer programs to guide people thru their pain and the trauma but still knowing that their loved one lives on. As they like to say it is the gift of outliving yourself.

December 4, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy, Housing, Education and Community Involvement

Guest: Blaine Coward the Vice President of Home Owner Services for Habitat for Humanity of Dallas

Topic: The theme of today's program was Home for the Holidays and Blaine Coward with Habitat for Humanity of Dallas joined me to talk about how Habitat works every day to make home ownership a reality for families. We talked about who was eligible to work towards a home with Habitat, the process of selection and the work that is done, or sweat equity, to build a house. We also talked about Habitat's financial literacy and homeownership classes that are available online to anyone who is looking to purchase a home, the programs for first time home buyers and the savings programs that help people build up their credit and their savings so that they can afford to get in to a home. We also talked about how the community can help and the impact that home ownership has on a family but also on the local economy and we talked about Habitat for Humanity's advocacy work to create more affordable housing communities in Texas.

December 11, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Economy and Education and Child Safety

Guest: Karen Hughes the President and CEO of Vogel Alcove a nonprofit that helps homeless children in our area. Topic: Karen Hughes joined me to talk about the upcoming Day 1 DFW a benefit event that will be held January 1st at the Irving Convention Center with proceeds benefitting Vogel Alcove. Vogel Alcove is a nonprofit that helps the youngest victims of poverty in North Texas, homeless children. Karen talked about all the fun activities that will take place at Day 1 DFW but also the importance of an event like this to raise awareness about the issue of homeless children since so many people think the homeless are alcoholics or drug addicts and don't think of the youngest victims and their families. Karen talked about the programs that Vogel has in place to help kids from infant to 15 and their families as well so that the parents can get on their feet and break the cycle of poverty. We talked about the importance of early education for homeless children and how the programs offer a mental safety net for the kids so that they can feel safe and loved and not afraid of their financial circumstances or feel

less than other kids.

Topic: The SPCA of Texas' annual Home for the Holidays event is once again highlighting the need for families to adopt animals who are in shelters across the area. Maura Davies the Vice President of Marketing and Communications for the SPCA of Texas joined me to talk about the need and to talk about the work that the SPCA does year round to get animals adopted and how they work to spay and neuter animals to decrease the population of unwanted pets in North Texas. Maura talked about all the programs that they have in place including classes to teach people how to take care of new pets and grief groups for those who have lost a pet. She also talked about their work in preventing abuse of animals in our area.

December 25, 2022 Aired 10am to 10:30am 30 minute program

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues, Veterans and Military Support

Guest: Jacob Schick the CEO of One Tribe Foundation

Topic: On this Christmas Day Jacob Schick joined me to talk about how the military celebrates Christmas and what it means to

our men and women in the military when people remember them during the holiday season. We talked about the mental health struggles of our veterans and how the holidays can trigger sadness because of what our veterans have been through and seen. We talked about the recent suicide of a Garland police officer and the need for law enforcement agencies to put mental health issues front and center and the work that the One Tribe Foundation does to help those dealing with PTS, depression, anxiety. The One Tribe Foundation aims to help veterans, first responders and our law enforcement community and their programs include animal therapy, gardening therapy, wind therapy with outdoor activities, peer to peer groups and one on one with professional counselors. Jacob who is a purple heart recipient shared his personal story of dealing the anger and depression and how he uses his story to help others.
