July-September 2017

(July 6 - Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Greg Akagi visited with custom harvester Tracy Zeniar, whose family travels from Texas to the Northern Plains each year cutting wheat for farmers. She talked about the life of a custom cutter and some of the challenges they face, including weather delays and breakdowns. As wheat acres shrink, she wonders about their future.

(July 14 - Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Dan Holstrom of the U.S. Meat Export Federation talked about the status of U.S. beef exports and President Trump's plans to re-negotiate the North America Free Trade Agreement. Canada and Mexico are among the largest markets for American beef. Holstrom also commented on the recent announcement that China will now begin accepting U.S. beef, but expressed concern over strict requirements that could limit the amount of beef eligible for export.

(July 19 - Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Kansas Governor Sam Brownback talked about his annual Kansas Water Tour. Brownback said water, and especially water conservation in the Ogallala aquifer, has been one of his highest priorities as governor. Brownback was instrumental in establishing a 50 year Water plan for Kansas that neighboring states are beginning to copy.

(July 27 - Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Lane Nordlund with the Northern Ag Network in Billings, Montana, described the devastating wildfires in northern and eastern Montana that have impacted the ranching industry industry in that state. Nordlund said the fires have destroyed thousands of cattle and left cattlemen without adequate forage to feed cattle through the fall and winter.

(August 3 - Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Dan Johnson visited with KSU Range Beef Cattle and Nutrition Management Specialist K.C. Olson about the latest research on burning native grass to control serecia lespedeza. Olson said research shows burning native grass in summer or early fall clearly indicates it's more effective in controlling the noxious weed than traditional burns in the early spring. He also said summer burning would help prevent air quality problems in urban areas.

(August 10– Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Tatum Toland, a registered dermatologist with Rick's Dermatology, talked about the dangers of skin cancer among farmers and ranchers. She said working outside increases the likelihood of developing skin cancer, which can sometime lead to serious forms of the disease. She recommended producers should do self-examination on a regular basis and see a dermatologist at least once a year.

(August 17 - Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Greg Akagi visited with Tom Sleight of the U.S. Grains Council about grain export issues, including the re-negotiation of the NAFTA agreement. Sleight said Mexico is now the largest market for U.S. corn and wheat, and major changes to the agreement could put that market in jeopardy. With the U.S now out of the Trans Pacific Partnership Trade deal, Sleight said it was essential the Trump administration work to establish a bilateral trade agreement with Japan.

WIBW Radio and the Kansas Agriculture Network sponsored a Beef Producers Information Seminar in conjunction with the Flint Hills Beef Fest in Emporia. The program featured comments from Kansas Livestock Association president David Clawson on wildfire recovery.
