AUDRA MORROW WITH SAFE FAMILIES DISCUSSED PROGRAMS TO HELP FAMILIES IN CRISIS SITUATIONS. (6)

2.) Issue – Importance of Blood Center

Program – A Closer Look – February 12, 2017

THE GUEST WAS BRIAN BISHOP WITH THE MARSH REGIONAL BLOOD CENTER IN KINGSPORT, TENNESSEE. AMONG THE TOPICS DISCUSSED WERE THE FACT THAT 2017 IS THE 70TH ANNIVERSARY FOR MARSH. HE ALSO DISCUSSED THAT MARSH SERVES 17 HOSPITALS AND FOUR CANCER CENTERS IN THE AREA. MARSH IS THE ONLY LOCALLY-BASED BLOOD CENTER IN THE REGION. 20 PERCENT OF THE LOCAL BLOOD SUPPLY COMES FROM HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. OTHER TOPICS DISCUSSED INCLUDE THE FACT THAT MARSH MUST COLLECT 100 UNITS OF BLOOD EACH DAY IN ORDER TO SUPPLY THEIR CLIENT FACILITIES. (30)

3.) Issue – Police Update

HE ALSO DISCUSSED THAT MARSH SERVES 17 HOSPITALS AND FOUR CANCER CENTERS IN THE AREA. MARSH IS THE ONLY LOCALLY-BASED BLOOD CENTER IN THE REGION. 20 PERCENT OF THE LOCAL BLOOD SUPPLY COMES FROM HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. OTHER TOPICS DISCUSSED INCLUDE THE FACT THAT MARSH MUST COLLECT 100 UNITS OF BLOOD EACH DAY IN ORDER TO SUPPLY THEIR CLIENT FACILITIES. BISHOP ALSO TALKED ABOUT MARSH'S ANNUAL GOLF TOURNAMENT WHICH FUNDS SCHOLARSHIPS. IT'S COMING UP ON APRIL 21ST. ACCORDING TO BISHOP, MARSH REGIONAL BLOOD CENTER IS ALWAYS ON THE MOVE, HOLDING OVER 700 MOBILE BLOOD DRIVES EACH YEAR. (30)
