7) Supplemental Recruitment Initiatives.

a) Initiative: Participation in Events/Programs Sponsored by Educational Institutions.

In an effort to encourage more Native American students to seek careers in the broadcast industry, Northern Arizona University has collaborated with broadcast industry sponsors to host a Native American High School Broadcast Workshop in June 2016. The workshop is supported by the Arizona Broadcasters Association, KPNX-12 News, NAU Native American Cultural Center, Native Public Media, KTNN Radio, NAU College of Social & Behavioral Sciences, NAU School of Communication, and Republic Media.

b) Initiative: Navajo Nation Wide Job Fair.

Both stations KTNN and KWRK promoted the job fair, scheduled on Wednesday, April 12, 2017 at the Kayenta Township Hall Meeting Room. The Job Fair was hosted by the Navajo Nation Department of Personnel Management and the Navajo Workforce Development Office.

c) Initiative: Mentoring Program for Station Personnel.

NBE maintains a mentoring program through which station employees expressing an interest in a particular area of radio broadcasting may receive career guidance and counseling. These areas include programming, sales, marketing, engineering, and administration.
