FCC quarterly issues, July, August, September 2023

Tuesday, July 4, Alan Waters, candidate for Congress first congressional district, discussing issues important to him including border security, Social Security stability and the war in Ukraine.

Wednesday, July 5, Paul Lebon, candidate for Congress, first congressional district discussing issues in the campaign including abortion rights, trans gender issues, and foreign aid. This candidate later withdrew from the race.

Tuesday, July 11, city Council member Brian Thompson discussing Woonsocket city issues including the dignity bus, spending of American rescue funds properly and selling of city property to developers.

Wednesday, July 12, Mayor Lisa Baldelli-Hunt discussing Woonsocket city issues including progress on the Cass Park reconstruction, plans for a new city Public safety complex and new businesses planning to open in Woonsocket.

Tuesday, July 18, Walter Berbrick, candidate for Congress in the first congressional district discussing issues including protecting abortion rights, why the green deal on the environment is important and ongoing war in Ukraine.

Wednesday, July 19, Pawtucket state senator Sandra Cano, candidate for Congress in the first congressional district speaking about issues including fighting for working families across the state, working to ensure the children get a quality education and being on the front lines with advocates and legislative champions to protect the right to abortion.

Tuesday, July 25, Aaron Regunberg candidate for Congress in the first congressional district including the right of every woman to make her own healthcare decisions, the ability of workers to build unions for a better life and to stop big pharmaceutical companies and big banks and big oil companies from ripping us off.

Wednesday, July 26, Spencer Dickinson candidate for Congress in the first congressional district speaking about issues including jobs in the economy, making good decisions at the legislative level and global warming and the sea level rise and nuclear disarmament.

Tuesday, August 1, Don Carlson candidate for Congress in the first congressional district speaking on issues including the continuation of the Ukraine war, clean energy, affordable housing, open government and education.

Wednesday, August 2, Rhode Island Governor Dan McKee speaking on state issues including his education initiative, status of the Tidewater stadium building project and status of the superman office building restoration, ethics in state government and providing housing for the homeless.

Wednesday, August 9, John Gonsalves candidate for Congress in the first congressional district speaking on issues including building coalitions, getting federal funds for Rhode Island, renewable energy, protecting the environment and protecting reproductive freedom.

Tuesday, August 15, Terri Flynn, republican candidate for Congress in the first congressional district speaking on issues including fixing tax policies in the federal government, protecting Social Security and protecting the environment.

Wednesday, August 16, Gerry Leonard republican candidate for Congress in the first congressional district speaking on issues including ensuring a strong military to protect the country, Control of artificial intelligence and technology and protection of the first and second amendments of the constitution.

Tuesday, August 22, city Council member John Ward speaking on Woonsocket city issues including toxic atmosphere within city hall, timely reports on city fiscal matters from the finance Director, cleaning up tax bills for the city and the status of city nonprofits and whether they should pay full taxes or some taxes or stay exempt.

Wednesday, August 23, Woonsocket mayor lisa baldelli-hunt speaking on city issues including the sale of the All Saints property, the status of CVS corporation in Woonsocket, The planned demolition of the Ho Kong building, the direction of building two schools in the Fairmount district and the importance of a city tax assessor.

Tuesday, September 5, state representative Robert Phillips speaking on state issues including fixing state roads through the department of transportation and legislation to assist small businesses.

Tuesday, September 12, Woonsocket city Council member John Ward speaking on local issues of concern to the city of Woonsocket including a tax amnesty program, status of the waste water treatment plant, lingering negotiations between the city and local 732 Woonsocket firefighters union.

Wednesday, September 13, Woonsocket Mayor lisa baldelli-hunt speaking on local issues of concern to the city including The value of water and selling it to the town of North Smithfield, the status of Dunn Park and not using it to build new schools, the use of American rescue funds for city projects

and an update on businesses ready to open in Woonsocket.

Tuesday, September 19, after winning the primary on September 5, Republican candidate Gerry Leonard is back in studio to discuss issues in his November 7 runoff election including Afghanistan and that the US economy is the key issue in this campaign.

Wednesday, September 20, public works Director Stephen D'Agostino speaking on issues in Woonsocket including snow removal, localized flooding, waste water treatment plant, Synagro treatment plant, and oversight of the two facilities on Cumberland Hill Road. He also offered an update on the Cass Park gravel removal project and the money it is bringing in to the city of Woonsocket against the expenses. he also spoke on the value of water to the city.

Wednesday, September 27, Judith Sullivan, chairperson of the Autumnfest steering committee talking about the biggest event of the year in Woonsocket and its economic contribution to the city and the kinds of activities that will take place on October 7, 8 and 9.
