Brief Description of Discussion:

Host Kaylin Mozdzen met with the Richland County Sheriff to discuss some of the biggest issues that are facing the Midlands in terms of crime, what they are doing to combat that, and the role the Canine Unit plays in the community. They also discussed one of their biggest fundraising events of the year, the Guardians of the Night K9 5K, and what the money is used for internally.
