

AMENDMENT TO CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMING REPORTS

In response to a question from FCC staff, Mission Broadcasting, Inc. ("Mission"), licensee of television station KJTL(TV), Wichita Falls, TX (the "Station"), reviewed all of its quarterly Children's Programming Reports filed during the 2014-2022 license term. As a result of that review, the Station determined that its 2Q 2018 report inaccurately indicated that two make-goods for preempted episodes of "Xploration: DIY Sci" had not aired in their second home.¹ Accordingly, the Station hereby amends the 2Q 2018 Children's Programming Report to respond "yes" to the questions regarding whether make-good episodes of "Xploration: DIY Sci" aired in their second home.

The Station also notes that four other programs listed on the 2Q 2018 report—specifically, "Xploration: Outer Space," "Xploration: Earth 2050," "Xploration: Awesome Planet," and "Xploration: Weird But True"—each were preempted one time and each aired a make-good episode of the program. Although only one episode of these programs was preempted, Station staff nonetheless identified the make-goods as not airing in their second home. Mission submits that such one-off instances were *de minimus* or, in the alternative, amends the 2Q 2018 report to respond "yes" to the questions regarding whether make-good episodes of "Xploration: Outer Space," "Xploration: Earth 2050," "Xploration: Awesome Planet," and "Xploration: Weird But True" aired in their second home.

Similarly, the Station notes that one program listed on the 3Q 2018 report—"Xploration: Outer Space"—and one program listed on the 4Q 2018 report—"Rock The Park"—were each preempted one time and each aired a make-good episode of the program. Although only one episode of these programs was preempted, Station staff nonetheless identified the make-goods as not airing in their second home. Mission submits that such one-off instances were *de minimus* or, in the alternative, amends the 3Q and 4Q 2018 reports to respond "yes" to the questions regarding whether make-good episodes of "Xploration: Outer Space" and "Rock the Park" aired in their second home.

¹ Prior to the 2019 revision of the FCC's children's programming rules, Core E/I programming that was preempted for any reason other than breaking news was required to air in a previously-selected substitute time slot—its "second home." The second home rule has since been eliminated and stations are now required to air make-goods for preempted E/I programming during a 7-day window either before or after the regularly scheduled air date.
