That reality became even clearer when, earlier this year, the only ambulance provider in Brewster County stopped operating. Issue 2: Drought conditions, combined with warm, windy weather has triggered extreme wildfire danger warnings in Texas, which is on track to experience one of the worst fire seasons in a decade. These stories look at the wildfires that have burned through Far West Texas so far and the dangers they posed.

Issue 3: In Midland, five officials at a local private school were arrested recently for allegedly concealing the sexual assault of a student. The event at Midland Christian School immediately sparked outrage. These stories look at the events leading up to and following the arrests at Midland Christian School.				
2/16/2022	Affidavit says private school officials in Midland failed to report and concealed a sexual assault	6:04 a.m.; 8:04 a.m.; 3:32:30 p.m.; 4:32:30 p.m.	0:00:56	Police on Wednesday arrested Midland Christian School's superintendent along with four other staff members. According to arrest affidavits, top administrators and staff were aware of an alleged incident where a high school baseball player was sexually assaulted by a classmate. Investigators say the superintendent and staff failed to report the incident to the proper authorities and worked to conceal it.
02/26/22	Police documents say top officials at Trinity School of Midland failed to report sexual assault	6:04 a.m.; 8:04 a.m.; 3:32:30 p.m.; 4:32:30 p.m.	0:00:52	In 2019, a middle school student was allegedly assaulted and harassed by a classmate over the course of months. Initially, a leader at Trinity described it as a "he said she said incident." Now, she's come forward with her story and four leaders at the school have been charged with a felony for attempting to conceal the abuse.
3/21/2022	Weeks after five Midland Christian School officials were arrested, questions still loom	6:42 a.m.; 8:42 a.m.; 4:48 p.m.	0:07:06	On Feb. 16, Midland Christian School Superintendent Jared Lee was arrested along with four other top officials for allegedly concealing the sexual assault of a student. In the weeks that followed, reports of abuse skyrocketed in Midland and alumni came forward to detail the culture at the private school.
Issue 4: The borderland dialect Caló is a colorful language heard throughout West Texas and beyond. These episodes highlight phrases and words from and explore their meaning with a personal anecdote. These stories are an effort to preserve Caló and educate others about it.				
1/4/2022	Caló: Talk to El Flaco, esa	12:01 p.m.	0:03:57	Today's feature is about 'el' and 'ese.' Since they come from Spanish, there are feminine versions of these articles 'la' and 'esa.' Like many languages, Caló provides for distinction of familiarity, those close versus strangers. 'El' translated into modern Spanish is simply 'the,' as in el paso. It's always inanimate, never refers to a human being except in rare and notorious cases, like El Chapo. In Caló, 'el' and 'la' confers familiarity. So when you refer to La Toña you're talking about the only Toña we know and can possibly be talking about. Ese and esa, on the other hand, say you're an outsider. You say esa to refer to the Toña who's not your cousin dismissively, without even saying her name. In this way all the Toñas in town are all but one outsiders. Other than La Toña, the rest are esas. It's a little complicated, but it's how you distinguish close friends and relatives from the eses and esas.

1/11/2022	Caló: Eh, vato	12:01 p.m.	0:03:35	Today's word is vato. This ubiquitous and metaphysical Caló word comes from the Spanish word chivato, billy goat. The premier definition of vato, even today, is the iconic image of Juarez movie actor, German "Tin Tan" Valdez in a zoot suit slinking through a narrow alley, cool, fierce and ready for action.
1/18/2022	Caló: There's a spot on your lisa, ese	12:01 p.m.	0:03:31	Today's Caló word is lisa. It means a crisply ironed shirt. It comes from the Spanish word for shirt, camisa. While it's a contraction of that term, it's also a Spanish adjective, liso, meaning smooth. A real vato makes sure to always have on a nicely pressed lisa, perhaps an unbuttoned short-sleeve linen in the summer and a fully buttoned up woolen or flannel in the winter.
1/25/2022	Caló: What a gacho coco	12:01 p.m.	0:03:47	The feature today is the word coco. It means wound, bruise, or skin cut. It's used either as baby talk — what a young child tells a parent, or as empathetic acknowledgement of a friend or relative's hurt. Outsiders suffer wounds and bumps. Close friends and kin have cocos.
3/1/2022	Caló: Go ask for some trolas	12:01 p.m.	0:03:35	This episode is about the word 'trola.' It means matchstick, wooden out of a box or cardboard from a book of matches. Trola is rooted solely in Caló. There is a word in Spanish that sounds close to trola, but it means something categorically different.
3/18/2022	Caló: Chupale al frajo	12:01 p.m.	0:03:43	Órale, today's feature in Caló is the word frajo. It means cigarette. There is nothing comparable or related in Spanish or English.
3/15/2022	Caló: Ponchados	12:01 p.m.	0:03:15	Órale, the feature today is the word ponchado. It means to get a flat tire. Ponchado also means deflated or depressed. It comes from the English word punch, as in to stick a needle in something, making it go down and be immobilized.
3/22/2022	Caló: He's desmadroso, always creating desmadres	12:01 p.m.	0:03:29	The feature for this episode is the term 'desmadre.' Its literal meaning is motherless or 'of no mother.' It's used to characterize a situation where there's no order or governance — chaos. Comparable terms in English are hullabaloo and commotion. One can cause or be a desmadre. Of course, there are also gradations of desmadre, where somebody is more desmadroso than the other desmadres in the cohort.
<b>Issue 5: The Big Bend region is full of natural and historic wonders -- the desert landscape and roaming wildlife. The area's deep history is worthy of exploring. These stories look at the natural wonders of Far West Texas, from the sky island of the Davis Mountains to the Chihuahuan desert and the stars above.</b>

It's nothing to pooh-pooh – in the right hands, ancient dung is powerful stuff. The scientists published their findings in fall 2021 – and they bring to life a vanished world.
