Windy conditions will make it feel even colder. Wind chills in parts of New England will approach 30 below zero. If you go outside, have every inch of skin covered. Temperatures in the South, where it's also been cold, rebound early next week. The winter storm that roared into the East Coast yesterday basically shut down several airports. Authorities at New York's John F. Kennedy airport say they are ready to resume flights today. Still, it's advised to check in with the airlines if you have plans to fly today. In all, nearly 5,000 flights were cancelled across the country on Thursday. It's so cold in Florida that iguanas are falling from trees. The cold-blooded creatures get sluggish when temperatures fall below 50 degrees. If it drops below that, it's too cold for them to move. It dropped below 40 degrees yesterday in parts of South Florida. Residents finding stiffened iguanas were advised to leave them alone, as they may feel threatened and bite once they warm up.
