She talked about the new federal guidelines that have nearly doubled the number of Americans

		eligible for lung cancer screening — proven to greatly reduce lung cancer deaths and what we should all know about the disease. Dyer mentioned Kathy Griffin's recent diagnosis with lung cancer and how it can strike non-smokers too.
