They discussed upcoming meetings: Tuesday, Oct 4 at 9 am at Last Chance Ministries, 404 Brady Blvd, SA at 9 am for the West side and Oct 17 at the South side and Oct 24 for the East Side. They are looking for a Pastor to oversee the North side.

The Sports org, offers baseball for kids 3-17 and has 650 kids on 25 teams. Soon basketball will start and also adult softball leagues. They have a 3 field sports complex and are seeking donations to help light the field in the future. Currently there are 4 teams on the East side. Cost is \$25 per team. They will provide uniforms, banquet and trophies. Last Chance Ministries also has a Gladiators gymnasium which costs \$1 per day to participate. Sponsors are needed for kids for that also. The South side has meetings that include law enforcement and council members. There are 400 people involved in BTG. At the meetings, they also include breakfast. The adult softball costs \$200 per team, up to 20 including men and women. To help the cost of these, you are encouraged to buy advertisements at the field. Games begin in November, once a week on Tuesday and Thursdays.

Last Chance ministries is good for kids and families. They include GED prep, sports, addiction help and many parents come because of the work with the children. They are available to provide needs to churches and groups . They loan chairs, sound systems and other need. There is no charge. There is also a BTG in Austin.

Recently Pastor Robles lost his daughter, Victoria, in a tragic crash. It happened on a Tuesday and Sunday he decided he is going to preach again with the strength that God gives him. His final statement, "God is Good."

Jason was born in Romania and came to the US in the 80's. His father is a pastor. At age 16 he strayed into a wrong crowd, began doing drugs and was in and out of jail. God rescued him from a long prison term and set him free because of the prayers of his parents. There is only one way out by the Grace of God. He wanted to help and bring the Gospel to those who needed to know.

Yuri came from Isbekastan also in the 80's and calls the US his country. He did well, had a good job, married with 5 children but felt he still wasn't happy and wanted to do more for the Lord. Because his dad was pastor and he attended church but didn't hear a call from the Lord to serve Him.

A friend told him about a ministry in Oregon. "God will Provide." He went there and spent three days. He was so impressed that this is the ministry he wanted to serve in. He was from CA and they were opening a center there. It grew quickly and they needed more buildings. He supervised a second center and still wanted to do more. God told him, "Don't be afraid. I will protect you." He felt the need to go to Matamoros, Mexico. All he heard about it was a bad and dangerous place. He got together with Jason and they met with the Mayor who told them they were an answer to her prayers. She had been praying for someone to come. They set up a men and women's center and had plans for an orphanage. They were donated land and the people in the Mayor's office, and neighborhood helped build and with evangelism.

They have a fund raising event scheduled for Sat. Oct 15 in Boerne, TX 78006. It will be all day and include fun things to do, praise and worship and a movie night. BTG helps with this ministry. Donations are accepted and information about the center are at Jason's phone. 971 300 5169.

The guest today is Elena Galvan. She gave her testimony as a rap song. Her past involved prostitution, addiction and a heart filled with hate. She met her husband, gave her life to Jesus and is now married with 3 children. She witnesses by telling others her story. She now has her feet on the ground and her heart burns for Jesus. She was raised by grandma because her dad didn't believe she was his daughter. She left home at 21 and lives on the streets for 2 years. It started when someone told her she was beautiful and could make money. Soon she was addicted to crystal meth and that is where all her money went. She could not work sober. She was arrested several times and spent time in jail. One night when drunk she went to a hotel with a man who raped her.

When she met her husband while on the streets, she believed he was "hers." He was a Christian who was backsliding and she began looking for Jesus. At one time they stole cars and stripped them. They paid the price for that by losing 3 cars. She was off the streets in 2007. During that time they were both saved. Currently they are Youth Leaders at Last Chance Ministries. They live on a street she used to "work" and reaches out to the prostitutes there.

Jimmy told of being in a restaurant where someone he had ministered to, spoke to him and told him of her new life.

She can share God's grace, through faith and is now sowing great seeds.

He told of a woman telling his wife that her son was in prison. She replied, "At least you can send him letters and hear from him. I will never hear from our daughter again."

There are plans for a Thanksgiving Dinner which have served 3-4000 people in past years. All are invited to partner with us. It is Nov 19. Another event called "Hope for Children" will be Nov. 5 at the SS Lion's Club, 4600 Pecan Valley 78223. It is a run/walk beginning at 9am with the run at 10 am. The proceeds go to abused children.

Guest: Pastor Joe Rosales. He was invited to BTG and has become involved. He sees that BTG reaches out to SA with a common goal of spreading the Gospel. He sees Good Happening with BTG. He grew up in CA and was raised by his dad along with 2 siblings. He felt his dad was a hard-working man but emotionally disengaged. He describes himself as a mess, angry, violent and out of control. His dad was there but not a disciple to him. He got into a gang for about 10 years.

The changing point in his life came in 1998. He asked himself, "Is this all there is?" He began feeling guilt. Then the Grace of God, God seeking him, opened his eyes. He asked God for help, cried for about 2 minutes and then felt an immense peace and wanted to serve God.

He received his GED, went to a university where he majored in drug and alcohol counseling. As he began attending Church, he felt a love for the church and evangelism and then went on to Bible College. He pastors at Christ Covenant, 1846 Bassie Rd, between Blanco and West Sts.

In 2014 she was appointed Mayor Protem when the previous mayor resigned but did not want to run for Mayor. The administration felt she was safe but not electable. She formed a Pastor's counsel in January. There were 13 at the first meeting. They had devotions and prayer. These got bigger and many wanted her to run for mayor. She continued to say "no" when she had a meeting with Condoleezza Rice in DC and she convinced her to run. She told her God had put her there for such a time as this. Lester Summeral started the mission. The funding needed is \$6.00 a month for each child for a year. Corporations all over the world provide the food and the ministry handles picking up, administration, transportation and distribution of the food.

One with urgent need is Uganda, where there are many refugee children from the Congo and Sudan. Another is Iraq, due to Isis. Giving is doubled when you provide for 1 child, it is for 2 a year. Phone 855 319 3853 to give gifts. This empowers the partnership to do its job.

Pastor Saoman Miswagi spoke next about Uganda. They share the food in the schools for 30,000 daily, and provide funds for education.

The children are refugees from war and without food many die and a big industry is small coffins for them. They have no citizenship and get 4 lbs. of food a month. Feed the hungry helps by providing a hot meal a day. He told the story of a young girl who fled to Uganda, both parents had died and she had no identity.

Another testimony from Priscilla, whose parents both died of AIDS and she also has is HIV +. She was taken in by an aunt who also had 5 other children and not enough food. She collects water and boils it for drinking and other needs. She walks with a limp but is still alive and wants to be a doctor thanks to Feed the Hungry.

Stephan spoke of the work in Iraq and Syria. They help Christians and Muslims by taking them to Urbeal and Kurdistan, a Kurdish area. These have fled ISIS for freedom. Feed the hungry provides food, supplies,

blankets and Bibles. They are so thrilled to get “The Life of Jesus” book and often read it right away.

Bob Boska started in 1995 and is Director of Operations, handling shipping and logistics. Many start as an emergency situation and lead to a more permanent ministry. Verkena Foso in E. Africa near the Sahara desert is another area in dire need of help. It is dry and difficult to live there. He told story of young girl lining there.

They spoke to Ken and Kendra who are working as missionaries at Managua, Nicaragua for 7 years. “Empty bellies have no ears.” So they help by feeding and helping them. There is no work, agriculture or education. They help many single moms with 8-9 children. There is hope for them at the Feed the hungry centers.

They appealed to faithful listeners to give and gift can be doubled. The children are overwhelmed with basic needs and God’ people can help. There were other stories told and again an appeal to help. 855 319 3853. They concluded by thanking all those who give and closed with prayer.

Lester Summeral started the mission. The funding needed is \$6.00 a month for each child for a year. Corporations all over the world provide the food and the ministry handles picking up, administration, transportation and distribution of the food.

One with urgent need is Uganda, where there are many refugee children from the Congo and Sudan. Another is Iraq, due to Isis. Giving is doubled when you provide for 1 child, it is for 2 a year. Phone 855 319 3853 to give gifts. This empowers the partnership to do its job.

Pastor Saoman Miswagi spoke next about Uganda. They share the food in the schools for 30,000 daily, and provide funds for education.

The children are refugees from war and without food many die and a big industry is small coffins for them. They have no citizenship and get 4 lbs. of food a month. Feed the hungry helps by providing a hot meal a day. He told the story of a young girl who fled to Uganda, both parents had died and she had no identity.

Another testimony from Priscilla, whose parents both died of AIDS and she also has is HIV +. She was taken in by an aunt who also had 5 other children and not enough food. She collects water and boils it for drinking and other needs. She walks with a limp but is still alive and wants to be a doctor thanks to Feed the Hungry.

Stephan spoke of the work in Iraq and Syria. They help Christians and Muslims by taking them to Urbeal and Kurdistan, a Kurdish area. These have fled ISIS for freedom. Feed the hungry provides food, supplies,

blankets and Bibles. They are so thrilled to get “The Life of Jesus” book and often read it right away.

Bob Boska started in 1995 and is Director of Operations, handling shipping and logistics. Many start as an emergency situation and lead to a more permanent ministry. Verkena Foso in E. Africa near the Sahara desert is another area in dire need of help. It is dry and difficult to live there. He told story of young girl lining there.

They spoke to Ken and Kendra who are working as missionaries at Managua, Nicaragua for 7 years. “Empty bellies have no ears.” So they help by feeding and helping them. There is no work, agriculture or education. They help many single moms with 8-9 children. There is hope for them at the Feed the hungry centers.

They help men and women find occupations and offer resources. They have some people who will hire those with criminal records. She also works as a bondsman to help get people out of jail. There is a high percentage of prison returns over 3 years. They begin the mentoring program with 1 on 1 every week and face to face event one time a month. They try to help with family needs. They also provide education to offenders in the field where they were incarcerated for: DWI, Possession of drugs, cognitive behavior, poor choices and robbery. They have referrals for school programs. They are encouraged to Pay it Forward after they are helped. There is also a Food pantry open 2 times a month and for emergency need. They are located at 3003 MLK Blvd on the East side, 78220. Phone: 210 531 6460. Sal believes that God provides and uses BTG.

He ended up without jail time and did community service, graduating High School in 3 years. He became involved in Victory Outreach International out of CA, was on the verge of divorce and turned his life around. He has been a pastor for 20 years now. In the 90's he worked with Christian Drama in SA. He worked at church in an unpaid position. Then he started a successful trucking business and gradually withdrew from serving God but has returned.

Paul his son, lived a good life but felt it was "Off" somehow. He encouraged his dad to begin serving again. He married again and had a fulfilled life with 2 daughters owning his own business. He now works as a sound man and youth leader at his church.

Guest: Keith Widemen from Haven for Hope, a nonprofit joint private and city undertaking which has a campus for the homeless near Mart and Trio Sts .It is 5 years old. It has shelter for 600 in the courtyard area where basic needs are met and 750 people on the other side with 650, serving 1350 people altogether. It is a transformation facility and people living there are required to be alcohol and drug free.

In the past, homeless people were treated with behavioral modification but they now they help people to determine their own destiny and rekindle their dreams. As children, we know we matter and as we grow older we lose sight of things and they deteriorate.

Keith was born in Columbus, Ohio in a post WW2 community. Going to church was more of a “Country Club” where people were “comfortable”. He heard the gospel at 20 and told his story of coming to know the Lord and serving in many capacities for 40 years. He worked during the Jesus movement in the US and Europe. He realized he was an administrator and began working at Haven for Hope in 2001. In 2003 his wife was very ill and he cared for her. They moved to SA and became involved working there. She is better but still has many issues with Autoimmune disorders.

He can relate to the homeless because he came to know who he is in Christ. As his wife felt better she read a book about the homeless and they got involved after seeing the homeless are “real” people. She works as she is able. His position is Spiritual Community Developer. Host Berta Branstorm of Nehemiah Initiative. NISanAntonio.com.

Guest: Keith Widemen from Haven for Hope, a nonprofit, joint private and city undertaking which has a campus for the homeless near west Martin and Freo sts.

Keith was on the program last week and they reviewed his testimony. He grew up going to church but met the Lord on the street during the “Jesus” movement. He worked 12 years in Europe, 10 years in southeast Asia and 20 years at a Christian Publisher, as an editor for 20 years. He has a heart for those who have lost their way and their dreams. All have been affected by trauma in addition to being homeless.

Haven for Hope has been opened for 5 years in a former factory area. They have 2 sides, an open courtyard with indoor dining, mats to sleep on, toilets, showers and free laundry use. In bad weather, they try to get everyone inside. The other side is now called transformational and they have a recovery program and need to be alcohol and drug free to enter the programs. They deal with, “what do you want in life?” and rekindle dreams. There are 90 partner agencies including a food bank, help in education, VA, Christian financial counseling, Medical care, Dental and Eye care. He is one of 5 employed in Spiritual services with over 100 volunteers.

He emphasized that “Love transforms.” One of the biggest contributors to homelessness is lack of community. They have addiction, abuse and bad choices in their life. Many others do too but someone has helped them with “Companionate Care”. Soul friends are needed to do ministry of presence, listening and prayer. They share God with them. There are 2 chapels on campus with 20 classes a week to help develop and grow spiritually. They found there were few homeless Jews and if they come to the shelter and their community finds out, they begin to help from their community. They serve 1350 people and there are 1350 churches in SA. To volunteer and get more information, havenforhope.org. Go to “Give” and drop to spiritual service.

Keith told of a success story of a man who went through their program and is now a Christian servant.

She lists 3 keys to rewire your brain to "positive". 1. Believe in God, 2. Approach life with gratitude and 3. A sense of mission. She suggests going to web site and doing a 30 day burning bush challenge.

All she writes is supported by Scripture. In Phillipians 4 it says, "Whatsoever is beautiful and good, think on these things." She and Berta closed with prayer and she will return next week.
