Billy is at 144 days sober. He became addicted as a sophomore in college. As a musician he fell into all kinds of drugs. On Dec. 25 last year his mother heard him talking to someone about buying drugs and he agreed to get help at TC. To enter the program he needed blood work and detoxed. He is getting a second chance and the undeserved love of Jesus.

Franklin Graham also promoted Adult Teen Challenge in SA and a testimony was given.

There are 900 000 drug and alcohol deaths in this country and leading cause of death in 25 states.

Ephesus: Lampstands are described. It is relevant to them because they kept lampstands going 24 hours ago. When God said to repent, they went out. The harbor moved out and the harbor was no more.

Smyrna. They were poor but rich. If they believed in Jesus they could not be in the union but were rich.

Pergamum: They had temples on the hill to other gods and were told to get to work and tear them down.

Thyratira: They were exclusive sellers of high end purple made of herbs and sea shells. Lydia who is one, is mentioned in Acts:16:14

Sardis: it as the Acropolis on the hill. They thought it would survive but was destroyed by earthquakes and conquers during the night. That was a wake-up call of a thief coming in the night.

Philadelphia: The Coliseum was there and there were 3 large pillars still standing in the 6th century. It was not excavated much. They were overcomers and there were positive things said about them.

Lacodocia: Lukewarm. Water piped to them became lukewarm and undrinkable so they knew its significance.

Guests today from Teen Challenge. Marketing co-ordinator, Carmen Simon and Kelsey Stoneking and Bethany Stone.

Teen Challenge began in 1958 by David Wilkerson who began working when he saw a notice of 7 people on trial for murder. He came from PA to NYC as a white country boy because he felt called to help these young people. The people were in gangs, into drugs and a multi-racial, tough crowd. There are 250 centers in the US and 1000 worldwide. Because of one man's obedience to God.

Carmen spoke first. She was court ordered there or face prison. She had a failed marriage and 2 children. There is a onetime fee of \$1500 which includes room and board and gas to go to work or missions to churches for them. It is a 12 month program. If money is unavailable, no one is turned away. Monday-Friday they are busy with work and Bible Study and memorizations of 250 Scriptures. They make crosses to sell and maintain a Thrift store at Pat Booker Rd.

Kelsey spoke next of living in a faith based home but rejected her parents faith. She attempted suicide at 13, had low self-esteem and was into drugs and abusive relationships. In and out of jail from age 16, she too was court ordered and went to TC after detoxing. Her heart opened to Jesus and He worked in her life.

Bethany spoke next. She is 19 and in the program for 6 months. She lived in Frisco, TX and people come to TC from all over the world. Her parents were missionaries but split up and father is now in prison. She had a bad time with step-father and became addicted to drugs. She was convicted of 3 felony charges and also was court ordered to TC. Most are not court ordered.

TC is for men or women aged 18-65. Contact number: 210 624 2075. They accept donations of money and items for the thrift store. Carmen closed the program in prayer.

Urban missionaries, host Berta Branstrom

Guest: Katerina Reyes who works for “The Day of the Latina Woman and her family” which serves all of San Antonio.

Her desire is to be the hands and feet of God and He meets her needs. She helps with all kinds of resources: wheelchairs, diapers, parenting classes, housing, ministers to those out of prison, food stamps and CHIP for children. She has been a community health worker for 8 years and is now employed.

Katerina’s background is from the drug culture and lived in a “den of iniquity”. She spent a year in prison, lost husband and gave children to her mother. She was convicted in prison and wrote to Pastor Grace of Lakeview Baptist church and after a 90 day rehab she became a worker at the church. She spoke of how terrible prison is and did not want to return.

The pastor took her in and together they begin a ministry called “Awakening”. They taught women discipleship, parenting, managing money and helped them get jobs. They had a 50 % success rate. God brought her from darkness and she was redeemed for His Glory. She has began sharing “care” packages to prostitutes offering them “Hope”. She shares her testimony with them.

Bert Durenburst: President of the prolife group in Holland, "Cry for Life", the major prolife group in Holland.

Allen spoke first. He noted that his foundation works with a Christian view of law. He started in 1993, leaving his position in a law firm to become a professor of civil procedure at St. Mary's College. He accepted Christ as an adult and felt called to do this.

He noted that God was removed from schools in 1962, No fault divorce in 1970 which affects children, then in 1973, abortion, killing unborn children. God has allowed our country to go on in our evil ways, choosing evil over good.

He discussed the death of Judge Scalia affecting the Supreme Ct. As it is, a 4 to 4 decision reverts back to original ruling. Nine are need to be a majority vote. He feels that the Supreme Ct is captured by Satan and asks people to cry out to God for them to make Godly rulings. Many children live in turmoil, instability, disaster and are the least and lost with no lifeline and are overlooked, and ignored.

Lester Summeral started the mission. The funding needed is \$6.00 a month for each child for a year. Corporations all over the world provide the food and the ministry handles picking up, administration, transportation and distribution of the food.

One with urgent need is Uganda, where there are many refuge children from the Congo and Sudan. Another is Iraq, due to Isis. Giving is doubled when you provide for 1 child, it is for 2 a year. Phone 855 319 3853 to give gifts. This empowers the partnership to do its job.

Pastor Saoman Miswagi spoke next about Uganda. They share the food in the schools for 30,000 daily, and provide funds for education.

The children are refuges from war and without food many die and a big industry is small coffins for them. They have no citizenship and get 4 lbs. of food a month. Feed the hungry helps by providing a hot meal a day. He told the story of a young girl who fled to Uganda, both parents had died and she had no identity.

Another testimony from Priscilla, whose parents both died of AIDS and she also has is HIV +. She was taken in by an aunt who also had 5 other children and not enough food. She collects water and boils it for drinking and other needs. She walks with a limp but is still alive and wants to be a doctor thanks to Feed the Hungry.

Stephan spoke of the work in Iraq and Syria. They help Christians and Muslims by taking them to Urbeal and Kurdistan, a Kurdish area. These have fled ISIS for freedom. Feed the hungry provides food, supplies, blankets and Bibles. They are so thrilled to get "The Life of Jesus" book and often read it right away.

Bob Boska started in 1995 and is Director of Operations, handling shipping and logistics. Many start as an emergency situation and lead to a more permanent ministry. Verkena Foso in E. Africa near the Sahara desert is another area in dire need of help. It is dry and difficult to live there. He told story of young girl lining there.

They spoke to Ken and Kendra who are working as missionaries at Managua, Nicaragua for 7 years. "Empty bellies have no ears." So they help by feeding and helping them. There is no work, agriculture or education. They help many single moms with 8-9 children. There is hope for them at the Feed the hungry centers.

His background is growing up a pastor's kid. His father was saved during the Jesus movement and then his mother as a drunk. Both loved Jesus and served a church for 25 years.

At 18 he wanted to leave and go to be an attorney at UT. His mother prayed for him and he heard the call for him to meet Jesus and he began to preach. He later joined YFC and the numbers went from 93 to currently 4000 youth. He started first as ministry director and Exe. Director for 10 years. There are currently 18 clubs.

The ministry started after WW!!, Billy Graham was the first director. SA has had it for 53 years. Their motto is: "Anchored to the rock but geared to the time." Most participants use screens for information even in live events.

They do have access to public schools and can get into all of SA schools. (There are lies that they do not.) The biggest need is volunteers. They ask for 1 hour a week for a year. They work first at personal relationships with the youth and then present the gospel. They do after school and even some Character building classes in the schools. Statistics show that each teenager needs 6-8 adults to interact with them to help them mature.

Their holistic approach is: Education success, Spiritual and moral success, Civic success, Economic success, Health and Safety success and even involve them in the arts. “Dancing.” Information is spread “Word of Mouth.” He gave a testimony of a young woman who became salutatorian of her class and was offered a scholarship. She was afraid to leave her mom behind but her mom’s statement was, “That’s what I worked for.” She is a lawyer now and helps in the local YFC. Their goal is “Crisis to Philanthropy.” Many have hunger for Jesus and he finds many YFC alumni involved in the schools who are willing to help. He feels every kid is “in

Pastor Saoman Miswagi spoke next about Uganda. They share the food in the schools for 30,000 daily, and provide funds for education.

The children are refuges from war and without food many die and a big industry is small coffins for them. They have no citizenship and get 4 lbs. of food a month. Feed the hungry helps by providing a hot meal a day. He told the story of a young girl who fled to Uganda, both parents had died and she had no identity.

Another testimony from Priscilla, whose parents both died of AIDS and she also has is HIV +. She was taken in by an aunt who also had 5 other children and not enough food. She collects water and boils it for drinking and other needs. She walks with a limp but is still alive and wants to be a doctor thanks to Feed the Hungry.

Stephan spoke of the work in Iraq and Syria. They help Christians and Muslims by taking them to Urbeal and Kurdistan, a Kurdish area. These

have fled ISIS for freedom. Feed the hungry provides food, supplies, blankets and Bibles. They are so thrilled to get "The Life of Jesus" book and often read it right away.

Bob Boska started in 1995 and is Director of Operations, handling shipping and logistics. Many start as an emergency situation and lead to a more permanent ministry. Verkena Foso in E. Africa near the Sahara desert is another area in dire need of help. It is dry and difficult to live there. He told story of young girl lining there.

They spoke to Ken and Kendra who are working as missionaries at Managua, Nicaragua for 7 years. "Empty bellies have no ears." So they help by feeding and helping them. There is no work, agriculture or education. They help many single moms with 8-9 children. There is hope for them at the Feed the hungry centers.

Vision: Help people dream again and to reach those dreams.” It is a Compassion ministry. People can’t dream if their basic needs are not being met. We meet their needs and help them produce.

Warren is from Baton Rouge, LA and began as a children’s minister at age 15 at Jimmy Swaggert’s church. He spoke of an occasion where he sought out a family with his mother at age 17. The man had lost his job, had 5 children, one handicapped and he found him living with relatives and gave them a Thanksgiving dinner. This was 29 years ago.

They help the elderly with home care, using city equipment and work with CPS. They first started in 2010 working with then City Counsel person, Ivy Taylor, for District 2. They asked, "What do you need for your district?" She is a believer who serves everyone. She gave them a list for help with the elderly, vets, homeless, children and families.

In 2014 she was appointed Mayor Protem when the previous mayor resigned but did not want to run for Mayor. The administration felt she was safe but not electable. She formed a Pastor's counsel in January. There were 13 at the first meeting. They had devotions and prayer. These got bigger and many wanted her to run for mayor. She continued to say "no" when she had a meeting with Condoleeza Rice in DC and she convinced her to run. She told her God had put her there for such a time as this. She agreed and there were 30000 new voters registered. She won by 3000 votes. She began having pastor's prayer breakfast's every month and asked for church input and for churches to get involved. They became city wide and 1500+ met at Cornerstone Church, with 100 churches represented.

Then she moved into having events in the South Side. Currently there are prayer breakfasts every other month downtown and prayer lunches in the various districts in the even months. Her prayer is for believers to be raised up to fill elected positions.

They have a food pantry to those in crisis and now help with mentoring, helping with goals, resumes, clothes, interview skills and all services are free.

The building is in an old bar and dance hall at 321 N. General MuMullen , across the street from the Rosedale Point, next to a storage facility with an Oak Hills sign in the front. There is also a church behind this building, "Oak Hills Westside Fellowship" with services Sunday at 10am and 12 noon.

The center helps with food and allows clients to pick food they know they will use. Nutrition classes are held and relationship building skills. They teach basic English, to read signs, applications for jobs and directions. On 09 14 16, City Bank will be doing a service project to help those in need, along with Dave Ramsey.

54:00 Hosted by Wayne Shepherd with Stephan Radolith, president of Feed the Hungry. They currently feed 100,000 children daily meals this year. They are thankful for Christian radio listeners who give generously.

Many children live in turmoil, instability, disaster and are the least and lost with no lifeline and are overlooked, and ignored.

Lester Summeral started the mission. The funding needed is \$6.00 a month for each child for a year. Corporations all over the world provide the food and the ministry handles picking up, administration, transportation and distribution of the food.

One with urgent need is Uganda, where there are many refugee children from the Congo and Sudan. Another is Iraq, due to Isis. Giving is doubled when you provide for 1 child, it is for 2 a year. Phone 855 319 3853 to give gifts. This empowers the partnership to do its job.

Pastor Saoman Miswagi spoke next about Uganda. They share the food in the schools for 30,000 daily, and provide funds for education.

The children are refugees from war and without food many die and a big industry is small coffins for them. They have no citizenship and get 4 lbs. of food a month. Feed the hungry helps by providing a hot meal a day. He told the story of a young girl who fled to Uganda, both parents had died and she had no identity.

Another testimony from Priscilla, whose parents both died of AIDS and she also has is HIV +. She was taken in by an aunt who also had 5 other children and not enough food. She collects water and boils it for drinking and other needs. She walks with a limp but is still alive and wants to be a doctor thanks to Feed the Hungry.

Stephan spoke of the work in Iraq and Syria. They help Christians and Muslims by taking them to Urbeal and Kurdistan, a Kurdish area. These have fled ISIS for freedom. Feed the hungry provides food, supplies,

blankets and Bibles. They are so thrilled to get "The Life of Jesus" book and often read it right away.

Bob Boska started in 1995 and is Director of Operations, handling shipping and logistics. Many start as an emergency situation and lead to a more permanent ministry. Verkena Foso in E. Africa near the Sahara desert is another area in dire need of help. It is dry and difficult to live there. He told story of young girl lining there.

They spoke to Ken and Kendra who are working as missionaries at Managua, Nicaragua for 7 years. "Empty bellies have no ears." So they help by feeding and helping them. There is no work, agriculture or education. They help many single moms with 8-9 children. There is hope for them at the Feed the hungry centers.

They appealed to faithful listeners to give and gift can be doubled. The children are overwhelmed with basic needs and God' people can help. There were other stories told and again an appeal to help. 855 319 3853. They concluded by thanking all those who give and closed with prayer.
