The Senate’s franchise tax bill proposing \$1.5 billion in rebates over three years is up for debate, contrasting with the House’s \$800 million two-year plan, amidst claims of corporate favoritism. Tennessee debates limiting minors’ social media use, mirroring Florida’s actions, highlighting the tension between state legislation, national policy, and the rights to online safety and freedom.</p>


