The courts pushed Morales' retrial back to January 2022 during a motion hearing today (Friday). Morales has expressed his intent to defend himself at retrial.

A U-S District Court Judge has sentenced a Bottineau man to 35 years in prison for shooting a Grafton Police officer. The U-S Attorney's Office says 38-year-old Ruben Cruz had a warrant out for his arrest on drug dealing charges when he opened fire on the officers coming to arrest him last October. He was also a felon who was not allowed to have a gun.

A couple was arrested at the state fair in Minot last night after a witness reported a child left alone in a car.

Most run-ins with a game warden involve checking hunting and fishing licenses and counting harvested animals.

The McHenry County Sheriff says a man was arrested yesterday (Thursday) for calling in a bomb threat at a bank in Towner. Sheriff Trey Skager confirmed the threat was called in to the Merchants Bank branch in Towner. Authorities blocked off a one-block radius around the bank while a bomb squad investigated as a precaution. After searching the building, the threat was deemed non-credible. The FBI and the North Dakota Bureau of Criminal Investigation also responded. The suspect's name is being withheld at this time.

on a C-felony burglary charge. Roed said that the 39-year-old Deck was not being cooperative and was placed in a detox cell. He indicated that Deck tore open the mattress and set it on fire with a match he had kept on himself. Roed said the fire set off the alarms, and Deck was immediately removed from the cell and the fire was put out. No one was hurt.
