OIL BOOM

Minot continues to struggle with issues associated with the Bakken oil boom.

7-11-2017 .29

Cypress Energy Partners says about 76 barrels of oil and 3 thousand and 228 barrels of saltwater were contained to the site, but a lightning strike started a fire that consumed 18 tanks.

7-17-2017 :51

The Bakken Conference and Expo is starting tomorrow and one of the themes for the conference will be jobs.

Governor Burgum opened the Bakken Conference and Expo in Bismarck today with a challenge to oil producers.

North Dakota has recovered from last year's oil slump, but the Department of Mineral Resources says it still has a long way to go before we're looking at oil boom numbers again.
