From Homelessness to Work

Host Pat Huber is joined by Gary Misspaugh, the executive director of the Allentown Rescue Mission and Troy Ingram, a former resident of the Rescue Mission and current member of the Missions "Clean Team" program. Discussions include the homeless population in the area and how the community can best support those in need. The Allentown Rescue Mission is a long term treatment facility for those suffering with drug and alcohol addiction, mental illness who often find themselves homeless. Troy tells of his situation of losing a job, losing a family member and also losing his health and how this led him to become homeless and without hope. He speaks of his entry to the Allentown Rescue Mission's value and living program which help to get him off drugs and alcohol and eventually his entry in the Clean Team program which offers employment to men in Troy's situation. Help is offered to those in similar situations.

Addiction Recovery

Today Pat Huber talks to Rev. Joel Jakubowski the Lancaster Teen Challenge Training Center Director and to Robert Diaz the Lancaster Teen Challenge Ministry Team Leader. The viewer is educated on what a highly successful drug rehabilitation center like Teen Challenge sees as the necessary parts to achieve that success. And the guests talk about how they treat those at their centers spiritually: believing that the student's symptoms are indicative of deeper problems and conflicts. Emotionally: healing past abuses as necessary step to future recovery. Physically: such as a drug-free environment, food, recreation, etc. And Socially: Students learn to work through relationship problems with their peers and with their families at home. The viewer also learns about the importance of Teen Challenge's new initiative of preventative seminars.

Foster Care

Today Pat Huber talks to Rachel Paashaus: Recruitment Specialist for Salvation Army Children's Services and to Dexter & Jo-Ann Lanigan, Foster Parents. The viewer learns about and state foster child needs; there are 500 children in foster children in Lehigh County and 28,000 foster children across the state of PA. With such a clear need to foster parents Miss Paashaus answers many questions and misconceptions that a prospective foster parents may have. From financial concerns, to explaining that it is good for prospective parents to be specific in their application on things like age, gender, special needs, etc. so that an agency can best match a child with a family.
