Program: Information You Can Use

Date: April 16, 2023

Time: 6a

Issue: Legal Issues/Community Focus

Duration of Discussion: 12 Minutes – No Guest. The host discussed the numerous raids by the State Attorney General, of the illegal bingo establishments throughout Jefferson County. The host reminded the audience that elected officials have an obligation to engage in legal economic development. The illegal bingo halls invite violence and corruption.

Date: April 23, 2023

Time: 6a

Issue: Legal Issues

Duration of Discussion: 12 Minutes - No Guest. The host discussed lessons learned from Fox Settlement. Fox Corporation and Fox News have agreed to pay \$787.5 million in a settlement for a defamation lawsuit brought by Dominion Voting Systems. The host discussed defamation laws and freedom of the press.

Date: April 30, 2023

Time: 6a

Issue: Finances

Duration of Discussion: 12 Minutes - No Guest: The host discussed that the Alabama House of Representatives passed Bill 217 (HB217) that would eliminate state income taxes on all overtime pay for Alabama hourly workers by excluding overtime, or any hours worked above 40 hours per week, from the state definition of "gross pay."

Time: 6a

Issue: Politics/Youth

Duration of Discussion: 12 Minutes – No Guest. Host discussed Alabama Junior Sen., Kattie Britt, along with Sen. Brian Schatz, D-Hawaii, and Tom Cotton, R-Ark., introduced a bill that would prohibit all children under the age of 13 from using social media and would require permission from a guardian for users under 18 to create an account.

Duration of Discussion: 12 Minutes – No Guest. The host discussed the prudence of the Water Works Board's decision to extend its budget by \$500 thousand dollars, to enhance its public relations footprint.

Issue: Legal Issues

Duration of Discussion: 12 Minutes - No Guest: The host discussed the Alabama Supreme Court's recent decision regarding the redemption value of tax delinquent properties. The Court emphasized that preservation improvements made, including additions and improvements to return the property to its proper use as a single-family dwelling. The Supreme Court approved the Court of Appeals broad interpretation of the types of improvements for which tax sale purchasers can seek reimbursement for during the redemption process.

Issue: Political/Healthcare

Duration of Discussion: 12 Minutes –No Guest. The host discussed one of the latest bills passed in the Alabama Legislature. Alabama now requires healthcare facilities to allow patients in isolation to have at least one visitor of their choice, even during a pandemic.

Issue: Politics/Legal Issues

Duration of Discussion: 12 Minutes – No Guest: The host discussed Jefferson County Commission's vote to hold a special election for the seat vacated by Rep. Fred Plummer, who resigned after being indicted for obstruction of justice. The host discussed the importance of voting in this special election and the need to elect persons who will work for the good of the community and not their personal interests.

Issue: Community Focus/Politics

Duration of Discussion: 12 Minutes – No Guest. The host discussed the fact that Montgomery water park is set to open despite a \$20 Million Dollar reversal of course to award the park state funds. The host discussed how legislators reversed a decision to award a \$25 Million Dollar payment to the park, after it was revealed that the funds were to come from the Educational Trust fund.

Duration of Discussion: 20 Minutes – No Guest. The host discussed the confusion and offense many people experience as the transgendered population appear to force labels on the heterosexual population.
