There is a debate over whether charter schools might be a more effective system than the long-standing public school method. Many feel that public tax dollars aren't being wisely used in Michigan's school districts. DeGrow says 1 in 8 Michigan children qualify as "special needs" students, and believes there are more effective ways to serve those needs in providing them a quality education.
