The Texas Health and Human Services Commission just extended the SNAP emergency food benefits. If you receive these benefits, you'll be seeing an extra amount of money on your card by Dec. 31st. All SNAP households will receive a minimum of \$95 in emergency allotments. Texans can apply for benefits, including SNAP and Medicaid, at YourTexasBenefits.com.
