Air Date: 01/10/16

Length: 60 minutes

Type: Local Public Affairs Program

DESCRIPTION: Bill Ritter spoke with Connecticut Governor Dan Malloy (D) about politics and the primary election season. Malloy said that he found Donald Trump's candidacy perplexing, disturbing, and entertaining, and called Trump a great showman. Malloy was also asked about his role as the head of the Democratic Governor's Association, which requires him to serve as a surrogate campaigner for democratic seats in Congress. Malloy stated that it is hard to tell what the campaign season will be like this early, but that he currently supports Hilary Clinton in her campaign for President of the United States.

Type: Local Public Affairs Program

DESCRIPTION: Bill Ritter spoke with political consultant Hank Sheinkopf about the political battle-turned personal between Bill Clinton and Donald Trump. Sheinkopf discussed the theory that Trump will back off of making fun of Clinton's romantic affairs because he doesn't want the entire Clinton family against him, and says that these affairs are a legitimate issue that will be discussed during the presidential campaign. Sheinkopf predicted that Ted Cruz (R) will win the Republican vote in the Iowa caucus, but that Trump could remain a viable candidate by coming in 2nd place. For New Hampshire, Sheinkopf felt that Bernie Sanders (D) would win the Democratic vote, but that the Republican winner could not be predicted. Sheinkopf also discussed Obama's recent gun control moves, saying that they were a smart move because he had the American public's support on this issue.

DESCRIPTION: Joe Torres and New York City Comptroller Scott Stringer discussed the city's search to find 1,000 workers who are owed money from work that they have done for various contractors in the past. Stringer said that so far, 53 workers have received over \$350,000 in unpaid wages, but that over \$3 million is owed in total. One man was given a check for over \$26,000 because he worked for a corrupt company. Stringer explained that when the Comptroller's office legally pursues companies and contractors who haven't been paying their employees properly and following the law, the company is debarred from working with New

DESCRIPTION: Bill Ritter speaks with Michael Bloomberg, former mayor of New York City, who is considering running for president. Ritter is joined by Douglas Schoen, Political Analyst, and Hank Sheinkopf, Political Analyst, to discuss their views on Bloomberg's decision and its impact on the presidential campaign. Based on last week's debate, Schoen thought that the winner was going to be Ted Cruz before the debate, but now thinks that Marco Rubio was the winner. Sheinkopf believes that Donald Trump was the true winner because he believes that he should've done something large to draw attention. Both men believe that Bloomberg is the complete opposite of Trump and would be a good competitor because Bloomberg has the ability to bring people together and provide real world solutions, particularly those pertaining to the economy. Although neither of them can predict who would win the election, they both agree that Bloomberg would be a beneficial addition to the election. Ritter further questions if Bloomberg's Jewish heritage puts him at a disadvantage in which both men disagree. For final remarks, both Schoen and Sheinkopf believe that both Trump and Clinton have an advantage for their respective parties.

DESCRIPTION: Bill Ritter is joined by Matt Katz, Wrote Book on Governor Christie, to discuss the new book, *American Governor: Chris Christie's Bridge to Redemption*. Katz discusses the impact the Bridgegate scandal had on Christie and his plan to redeem himself as a presidential candidate in the 2016 election. Katz further discusses Christie's comparison to Trump by saying that Christie isn't considered the bully in this election because of Trump's remarks. Ritter also asks Katz to weigh in on the personal aspects of Christie that are mentioned in the book. These include Christie's manner of arguing with his wife and their decision to not have children for seven years. If Christie loses this election, Katz predicts that he will find other professions, such as attorney general, and continue to run for the 2020 presidential election.

DESCRIPTION: Bill Ritter is joined by Hank Sheinkopf, Political Consultant, to discuss the outcome of the Iowa Caucus and the New Hampshire Primaries. In the Iowa Caucus, Hillary Clinton won by a hair against Bernie Sanders for the Democratic Party and Ted Cruz came in first while Donald Trump came in second for the Republican Party. Sheinkopf believes that this upcoming debate will be Chris Christie and Jeb Bush's last moments if one doesn't defeat the other. For the Democratic Party, Bernie Sanders gained momentum because he spoke about human interest topics such as Wall Street.

DESCRIPTION: Bill Ritter is joined by Doug Muzzio, CUNY Political Science Professor, to discuss the New Hampshire Primary. Muzzio discusses that Trump and Sanders are attracting to voters because they understand their anger and anxiety of the future. He also discussed that Sanders' messages of hope and change are similar to Obama's platform in the 2008 election. In comparison to Hillary Clinton, Muzzio believes that Clinton and Sanders are different because Clinton is more pragmatic while Sanders is more optimistic. Despite these two candidates, Muzzio is still unsure who the top two candidates will be for the presidential election.

DESCRIPTION: On this episode of Up Close, Bill Ritter is joined by Rep. Gregory Meeks, (D) New York, to discuss the Congressional Black Caucus PAC endorsement for Hillary Clinton. At the caucus, 90% of board members agreed to support Clinton and Sanders did not receive any votes. Meeks argues that because people are watching the election as a reality TV show, people need to look past the entertainment and acknowledge the substance the candidates are saying. Ritter further discusses Meek's opinion of Bloomberg's decision to enter the race in which he explains how Bloomberg will be popular among people who are unsure who they will vote for based on the two frontrunners of the election. Finally, Ritter asked why Sanders has not resonated with blacks and he explains that the Clintons have been advocates for blacks in America for a while and they do not feel Sander's platform would benefit this community.

DESCRIPTION: On this episode of Up Close, Bill Ritter is joined by Rep. Peter King, (R) New York, to discuss his recent decision to support Republican candidate, Marco Rubio, after Donald Trump's recent victories, the iPhone controversy, and the replacement of the late Supreme Court Justice. King strongly supports Rubio because he believes that Rubio's plans regarding homeland security and foreign policy are stronger than Trump's and would therefore make him the strongest candidate against Hillary Clinton. Ritter questions why King decided to endorse Rubio this late in the president campaign in which King explains that he was not going to endorse any candidate while Jeb Bush was in the race. King further discusses that despite his feelings about Trump, he will support the nominee of the Republican Party. Ritter changes topics to discuss the iPhone controversy and King's position on whether or not Apple should comply with the federal government's request. King believes that Apple should provide the code to encrypt the phone involved in the San Bernadino attack because it would be a system only used for this phone, no other iPhone user's privacy will be in jeopardy, and this can be used to protect further attacks from happening. Finally, Ritter asks whether or not King believes Obama should appoint a new Supreme Court Justice and King explains that although the president should not elect a new member in their last term as president, the American people are responsible for electing a president who is capable of choosing a new Supreme Court Justice.

Gonzalez discusses that there has been an increase in enrollment in the past two years with a 12% decrease in the number of Latinos uninsured. He believes that the reason why Latinos are not enrolling in the program is because of particular barriers, such as language. Gonzalez plans on addressing these problems to assist people in enrollment through community engagement and resources. Ritter further questions if being a pediatrician was beneficial when convincing her son not to play in which Hes explained that because she has had significant experience with head injuries, she was able to see, understand, and explain the consequences of a concussion.

He says that the problem stems from politicians failing to see the poor as a strong political force.

They said that these raids are detrimental to the community because they create a culture of fear and cause people to be afraid of going to work, school, hospitals, and other places that they need to get to in order to stay functioning in society.
