This program is a weekly round-table discussion about topics affecting and relating to Hispanic citizens in the Greater New York area.

## Here and Now

Airs Sundays 12pm-1pm

## **9/11 Fourteenth Anniversary Observance**

**Friday, September 11, 2015**

WABC's live coverage began at 8:27AM with special coverage anchored by Bill Ritter & Lori Stokes. Live reports included Dray Clark in Lower Manhattan, Stacy Sager at Point Lookout in Nassau County and Rob Nelson in Midtown Manhattan at Firehouse Engine 54, Ladder 4, whose coverage was cut short due to technical issues. The special included a look at how other states are honoring victims; a look at the special draw Ground Zero has to New Yorkers and to tourists; and live coverage of the ceremonies from 8:40AM to their conclusion at approximately 12:16 PM. These included the reading of the names of nearly 3,000 victims of the terror attacks. There were no commercial interruptions.

**DESCRIPTION OF SHOW:** Reporter NJ Burkett speaks with real estate developer, Larry Silverstein, about how lower Manhattan has been revitalized after the tragic events of 9/11/15. Three new skyscrapers are now complete, including the centerpiece of the Financial District, The Freedom Tower and two more skyscrapers are being built at The World Trade Center. The 9/11 Memorial and museum are also bringing people back to the area.

## **Papal Visit to New York City**

**Thursday, September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

WABC's live coverage began at 11:59 AM.

Shirleen Allicot and David Novarro are anchoring. Rob Nelson reports from the Capitol to summarize the morning of the Papal's visit and his speech given in the capitol. NJ Burkett is in Midtown where he reports about security on 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue. He also interviews people and their opinion on the security. Jim Hoffer reports from Central Park to discuss protection of the pope, which includes constant FBI security and investigations. Cefaan Kim is on the Upper East Side (72<sup>nd</sup> street) to show where the pope will stay, along with his security. Kemberly Richardson in Chelsea is at Xavier High School where students sat at a gymnasium to watch the Pope's speech. Ongoing coverage of the Pope being driven around Washington and walking around to meet with crowds of people is broadcasted through the newscast The coverage ended at 12:36 PM.

**Friday, September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2015**

WABC's live coverage began at 11:08 AM.

Ken Rosato and Shirleen Allicot anchor the coverage. Lori Stokes is live at the 9/11 memorial and describes what the pope has planned for the rest of the day. Tim Fleishcher is also at the 9/11 memorial who reports on the people that he has talked to who were lucky enough to speak to the pope personally for a certain amount of time. NJ Burkett stands outside of the UN building to summarize the address given to the United Nations by the pope. Jim Hoffer is in Lower Manhattan to describe the residence where the pope will be staying. Marcus Solis reports from East Harlem at Our Lady Queen of Angels school where pedestrians await the pope to come by. Kimberly Richardson reports from Columbus Circle reporting about the crowd trying to enter into Central Park. Anthony Johnson reports from Madison Square Garden to talk to a crowd that gathered hours before the pope's arrival. Bill Evans does the weather. The coverage ended at 1:00 PM.

## **Woman's Issues**

**Show Name:** NY View Point

**Air Date:** 07/13/14

**Length:** 30 Minutes

**Type:** Local Public Affairs Program

**DESCRIPTION OF SHOW:** Host Ken Rosato is joined in studio by Farnoosh Tarobi, author of When She Makes More. Tarobi says women are earning more than their partners, and her book addresses the hardships that come with that problem. Tarobi is the breadwinner herself in her marriage, and was inspired to write the book in hopes of advising similar women how to navigate a marriage when the wife makes more money than her husband. She says there are consequences to a husband relinquishing breadwinner duties and that communication breakdowns within the marriage are possible. Tarobi advises couples to establish savings plan goals to feel like equal players in the financial aspect of marriage and maintain dual responsibility. **Air Date:** 08/03/14

**Length:** 30 minutes

**Type:** Local Public Affairs Program

**DESCRIPTION OF SHOW:** Host Diana Williams is joined by Senator Kirsten Gillibrand from Washington D.C to discuss the increase in sexual assault on campus. Senator Gillibrand says many of these attacks are happening during freshman year in the first few months on campus and she is pushing for a law that would require every university in the country be surveyed about sexual violence.. The law would also require campuses to coordinate with local law enforcement agencies. Gillibrand says in order to get schools to comply they will increase fines for schools who don't report sexual crimes. Diana is also joined by Andrea Pino and Annie Clark, two victims of sexual assault on campus. Andrea says she felt like it was time to come forward and help bring awareness to the issue. Annie says initially she wasn't going to come forward but then reached out to UNC who gave her a very victim-blaming response. Annie says legislation needs to be passed in order to help the problem. **Length:** 60 min

**Type:** Local Public Affairs Program

**DESCRIPTION OF SHOW:** Host Sandra Bookman was joined in the studio by Mrs. America 2013-2014, Austen Williams. Williams discusses her platform "Shake the Shackles" which is fighting to end human trafficking. She speaks about her own experience being sexually assaulted and how it has inspired her to help those who are victims of devastating sex crimes. Williams says that Americans commonly do not realize that human trafficking exists within its own borders and that it is not just an issue overseas. The film 8 Days, in which Williams has a small role, is discussed and Williams encourages others, saying that even one person can do something to be a link in the chain to end trafficking. **DESCRIPTION OF SHOW:** Host Sandra Bookman is joined in the studio by Valisia LeKae, a Grammy and Tony nominated star and an ovarian cancer survivor. LeKae tells the story of how she was diagnosed with ovarian cancer and how the disease has difficult symptoms to detect, which makes it very threatening. She says that the symptoms of ovarian cancer include things like back pain and weight gain which most people would not take significant notice to, and would be quick to disregard. She says she has no family history of ovarian cancer and stresses that the most important thing is for women to know their bodies and educate themselves about diseases like ovarian cancer. LeKae is now the spokesperson for the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition. **Length:** 30 minutes

**Type:** Local Public Affairs Program

**DESCRIPTION OF SHOW:** Host Diana Williams is joined in the studio by U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand. Gillibrand talks about her new book *Off the Sidelines* which talks about her career path and being a woman in Congress. She shares stories of when people commented on her weight when she was pregnant and how her work had been devalued by bosses and peers and adds that people focus too much on women's appearances in politics and that it can be a deterrent. She believes in a zero tolerance policy for injustices against women, such as domestic abuse and sexual assault. Gillibrand talks about how she succeeded Hillary Clinton as U.S. Senator and how she was chosen by Governor Patterson for the job. She also addresses rumors that she may run for president in the future and says that she supports Hillary Clinton and encourages women to get involved in politics, saying more women would change government outlooks.

**Show Name:** Eyewitness News: Up Close with Diana Williams

**Air Date:** 09/28/14

**Length:** 30 minutes

**Type:** Local Public Affairs Program

**DESCRIPTION OF SHOW:** Host Diana Williams is joined in the studio by Quentin Walcott, Co-Executive Director of Connect, and Maria Mendez, Executive Vice President of the PAC Program. Walcott discusses the movement to redirect the ownership and responsibility of domestic violence from victims to batterers. Mendez adds that batterers need to be educated. They also discuss the Ray Rice domestic violence incident and say it is very common for the batterer to take control of the victim and the situation. Walcott says that Connect trains people to work with batterers and says that the sad reality is that domestic violence that occurs between public figures brings awareness to the issue. Mendez and Walcott agree that there is hope that abusers can be changed and that they would not do the work they do if they thought otherwise.

## **Law & the Judicial System**

**Show Name:** Eyewitness News: Up Close with Diana Williams

**Air Date:** 07/13/14

**Length:** 30 minutes

**Type:** Local Public Affairs Program

**DESCRIPTION OF SHOW:** In for Diana Williams is host Bill Ritter; he's joined in studio by Dravet syndrome patient Amanda and her mother Maryanne Houser, NYS Senator Diane Savino, wrongfully convicted entrepreneur Jeffrey Deskovic, and Beth Waitkus, founder of the Insight Garden Program with the help of Amanda Houser's efforts. Her mother Maryanne describes how she hopes the recent Medical Marijuana bill was passed by Governor Andrew Cuomo will help her daughter, who has had seizures since she was five and a half months old. NYS Senator Diane Savino speaks of restrictions and challenges that will now take place within other states since the bill has been passed, although patients with other illnesses will benefit from this bill. Later in the show, Jeffrey Deskovic speaks about his own foundation to help others like him who are wrongfully convicted of crimes they do not commit.. Deskovic claims there are no reforms passed in New York to help prevent wrongful convictions and that must change. Lastly Beth Waitkus speaks about establishing a program that utilizes therapeutic concepts to allow prisoners to have a transformative experience when gardening outdoors. She and Ritter agree that this is a great form of rehabilitation that will allow prisoners to cope and heal while performing work training. Instead of fewer traffic delays the report shows more gridlock caused by the bike lanes. The DOT's report is based on two runs per hour over a single day, while Eyewitness News based their results on eleven drives over three morning rush hours. The DOT claims on its report the average drive time as three minutes while Eyewitness News ended up with an average of six minutes, with the longest drive taking more than ten minutes. Trottenberg claims that at the time of the report the data is considered very valid, also the number of lanes remained the same after the bike lanes were added, and lastly the DOT report was done on July of 2011 while the Eyewitness News report was done in September of 2014.

While on vacation in Puerto Rico when, after a few drinks, Dr. Konrath began telling Joannah about how he would kill his ex-wife. Shocked, Joannah secretly took out her iPhone and recorded the conversation, complete with how he would shoot his ex-wife and then make it look like a suicide. 20/20 reports.

### **OJ SIMPSON TAPES**

Football legend OJ Simpson was found not guilty of murdering his ex-wife Nicole Brown Simpson and her friend Ron Goldman in his criminal trial 20 years ago next week. In that famous televised trial, Simpson evoked his right against self-incrimination by not taking the stand. Yet, in the civil trial brought against him, Simpson was forced to testify under oath for the first time on tape. Those tapes, part of a treasure trove of almost 150 boxes, have been stored under lock and key for almost 20 years. One hundred and fifty million people watched the criminal trial verdict – hardly anyone has seen these tapes...until now. Elizabeth Vargas reports.

## **BOSTON EMS**

Viewers will ride along with the proud men and women of the Boston Emergency Services, one of America's most seasoned team of first responders: the first step in the chain of trauma care. It was this same group that answered the desperate calls of runners and spectators two years ago when the bombs went off at the Boston Marathon. Treating the injured and ferrying the wounded to hospitals, the Boston EMS earned the gratitude of a shell-shocked and grief-stricken city with their cool-headed professionalism. Meet some of the heroes of that terrible day as they answer new calls and respond to a daily dose of trauma and mayhem.

### **Saturday, July 25, 2015 (Premiere – 9:00PM ET)**

- Cameras arrive at a harrowing scene of a car accident that has left a bicyclist dead and a driver having fled the scene. Paramedics remove from the wreckage a critically injured passenger. The young man pleads with them to tell him whether the bicyclist on the street survived or not – an answer they know but can't reveal.
- A man pulls himself out of a crashed car before it erupts into flames; a pair of accommodating EMTs surprise a barefoot homeless man with an unexpected gift; a tearful woman confides to an EMT about the devastating loss of her boyfriend whom it turns out he has a connection to; and it's all hands on deck as first responders scour the pitch-dark train tracks for a possible patient hit by the Acela express.

### **Saturday, August 1, 2015**

- An eleven-year-old boy sprints for the school bus and becomes a casualty of a hit-and-run driver. An EMT – who is a mother of five -- arrives at the scene to comfort the boy's crying mom who needs as much attention as her injured son.
- A cyclist is pinned under an SUV and is lucky not to pay the ultimate price for not wearing a helmet -- and the gloves are on as EMTs transport a woman in labor and debate who gets to deliver the baby if they don't reach a hospital in time. Paramedics wrestle with how to break the news to an accident victim that his friend is worse off than he is, and EMTs race through rush hour traffic only to get blown off by a patient who declines treatment so he can search for his missing phone.

### **Saturday, August 8, 2015**

- A driver going through a personal crisis deliberately crashes into a highway railing. A paramedic at the scene says this is more common than one might think.
- Also in this episode, a man avoids a spray of bullets and escapes with a single gunshot wound. When EMTs discover an old wound, they are less impressed by his luck and more concerned about his future. And a homeless man, hoping to spend the night in a warm hospital bed, decides to sit naked in a crowded Boston street. Elsewhere, EMTs responding to a young woman in the midst of a seizure discover that her service dog has answers to some of their questions. Finally, a woman suddenly falls ill and crashes her car into a house and a paramedic ends up in the middle of a parking lot fight.

### **Saturday, August 15, 2015**

- A driver who gets rear-ended reveals he was at Ground Zero during the 9/11 attacks. Through his stories as a photographer and volunteer on that fateful day, EMTs find a renewed pride in their roles as first responders.
- An EMT arrives at the scene of a motorcycle accident that hits close to home, and she must suppress her own harrowing flashbacks in order to care for the victim.

### **Saturday, August 22, 2015**

- EMT Janell Jimenez is working crowd control at the 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebration on the Boston waterfront. While handling a patient who is drunk and combative, she makes a misstep that lands her on a stretcher herself in an unexpected reversal of roles.
- An EMT is powerfully moved by the strength of a three year old with sickle-cell anemia, a painful blood disorder. As he carries her to the ambulance, thoughts of his own three year old daughter come to mind.
- A man jogging to the gym gets struck by a car that badly injures his leg, but he seems more upset about missing his workout; a drug addict gets a harsh scolding from an EMT concerned about the neighborhood children who could find one of his dirty needles in the grass. Finally, an old school EMS supervisor makes new friends at Boston's gay pride parade.

## **SAVE MY LIFE: BOSTON TRAUMA**

Viewers will get unparalleled access to top tier trauma teams inside the ERs and ORS of the nation's most prestigious hospitals including the Boston Medical Center, Massachusetts General, and Brigham and Women's. Lives that could be lost in lesser hands at less renowned medical centers are saved through feats of miraculous skill. The only certainty is that those who need care will receive the very best that medicine has to offer. This remarkable series tells many stories of heroism, poignancy, and unexpected humor.

### Sunday, July 19, 2015 (Premiere – 10:00PM ET)

- Cameras follow two young men who are gunned down on Main Street in the close knit Charlestown neighborhood of Boston. EMS evacuates the two victims to Massachusetts General Hospital where top surgeons wage a heroic battle to save the life of a 17-year old boy. The case takes an unexpected twist that even doctors can't anticipate.
- A nursing student discovers that the driver of the vehicle that hit her is also a nurse, a young mother with two broken legs is concerned about the meatballs she left cooking in the oven, and an injured motorcyclist can't resist spouting rap lyrics for a captive audience of doctors and nurses, and a police officer compliments a doctor-in-training who fixes his dislocated knee cap.

### Sunday, July 26, 2015

- A buddy's Go-Pro helmet camera captures the moment when an off duty firefighter is involved in a horrific motorcycle accident. Waiting for his patient to be medevaced to the helipad on the roof of Massachusetts General Hospital is Dr. David Fink, one of the nation's top trauma surgeons. Fink knows that time equals life and this patient is running out of both. The man's family is counting on Fink to work his magic.
- A teenager at a church gathering decides to hide in the bell tower during a game of hide and seek. What she couldn't know was that the floorboards would give way dropping her 25 feet on to a church pew; elsewhere, a man puts his arm through a glass window following an argument with his girlfriend and gets both stitches and relationship advice from a young doctor; outside the Boston Garden EMS personnel demonstrate tact and restraint when confronted by a spitting Bruins fan; and it takes the muscle of three orthopedic docs to get a volleyball player's dislocated ankle back into place.

### Sunday, August 2, 2015

- A teenage boy's hand is severed in a shocking car accident on a rural Vermont road. Despite the trauma, he summons help from a neighbor while a police officer locates the missing hand. Even if he can reach Massachusetts General Hospital, a successful reattachment surgery is a long shot. But, beating the odds is why hand surgeon Dr. Johnathan Winograd comes to work each day.
- Also in this episode, a Boston firefighter slips from the roof of a burning building and finds that what hurts most is his wounded pride. And a bad day gets worse when the local news reports that his wife is pregnant with the couple's third child – and they haven't told her parents yet! Two more tales round out the hour -- a bullet to the chest causes a young man to see the silver lining--a second chance to be a dad to four adorable kids who need him to stick around, and finally a man who just won't believe his car hit a tree, "it's just a branch, it's just a branch," he swears.

### Sunday, August 9, 2015

- A medical student rides thirty feet on the hood of the car that struck her while she was biking. If her boyfriend's daughter hadn't lent her a helmet, the outcome would have been very different. Elsewhere, a woman allergic to latex begins to suffocate after eating food prepared by kitchen workers wearing rubber gloves. The standard antidote is epinephrine, a drug sold at pharmacies that is easy to self-inject from an EpiPen. Those who suffer from anaphylaxis are often advised by doctors to never leave home without their "pens," but in this case, the patient forgot.
- An ER doctor keeps his cool when a patient becomes physically aggressive and has to be restrained. And two overdose cases highlight the incidence of heroin addiction among a group of veterans who served in America's wars in Afghanistan and Iraq.

### Sunday, August 16, 2015

- A young woman stumbles onto the tracks just as a commuter train pulls in to the station. Rescuers extricate her only to discover that this isn't the first time they've met. Also, a man who has been stabbed begs his doctors not to operate when they seek to repair internal injuries. He calls mom to tell her his news, but she thinks he's playing a prank.
- A man is visiting his daughter in the hospital is wracked by escalating chest pain that he has been dismissing as just an extreme case of heartburn. Luckily, world-class interventional cardiologists are stationed in the building and in minutes they are able to clear a blockage from his coronary arteries that would have proved fatal.

### Sunday, August 30, 2015

- A man is rushed to emergency surgery when doctors discover a tear in his aorta preventing blood flow to his lower body. His wife and two kids are upset with him for not taking his blood pressure medications. But anger turns to fear as they realize he could die or lose his leg.
- A young woman on the verge of winning a rock climbing competition loses her foothold and plunges 25 feet to the ground missing the landing mat. She vows to get back up on the wall soon, but now it's up to orthopedic doctors who must try to repair her broken foot.
- A young man who was lacerated by a knife-wielding assailant baffles doctors with his calm, Zen-like demeanor.
- A man tries to save his wife from falling down a flight of stairs, but ends up tumbling down with her. They reunite in the ER.

### **WHAT WOULD YOU DO?**

Using hidden cameras, "What Would You Do?" establishes everyday scenarios and then captures people's reactions. Whether people are compelled to act or mind their own business, John Quiñones reports on their split-second and often surprising decision-making process.

### Friday, July 3, 2015

- What would you do if a gay couple, eating at a local diner, displays affection and customers are rude, expressing unfavorable behavior to them?
- What would you do if you saw someone forcing intolerance on an inter-racial couple?

### Friday, July 10, 2015

- What would you do if a beautiful young woman asked you to pretend to be her boyfriend for 10 minutes, just so she can appease her meddling mother? How far would you go to keep up the lie?
- What would you do if you witnessed an older sibling bullying her adopted younger sister because she is of a different race?
- An elderly woman is shopping at a grocery store and asks random strangers for help. Yet the strangers have no idea what they're in for as the elderly person starts asking questions about everything. How will the helpers react?
- A customer pays for her order with money she's taken out of the tip jar at a local coffee shop. How will other customers react?
- In a preview of the July 17 Texas travel show, a Hispanic man and his Caucasian girlfriend are on a date at a local San Antonio restaurant, when they begin to be harassed by another customer, a Hispanic woman. She tells them that they should stick to their own kind and that races should not mix. How will bystanders react?

### Friday, July 17, 2015

- At a San Antonio restaurant, a family saying grace over their meal is interrupted by a woman – an atheist – who asks them not to pray in public. How will fellow diners react?
- A female customer expresses her displeasure when two cowboys hold hands and kiss while sitting at a BBQ restaurant in Blanco, Texas. How will other customers respond?
- At a gun store, a father wants to buy his young son his first gun for his seventh birthday. But a "What Would You Do?" actor confronts the father telling him the son is too young and the father is being irresponsible buying him a gun. How will other shoppers react?
- San Antonio has one of the nation's largest active and retired military populations. So what will happen when a military veteran at the check-out counter does not have enough money to buy his groceries? How will other shoppers react?
- A street musician is playing his guitar at a busy plaza. He is singing songs with lyrics that include obnoxious/rude descriptions of the people walking by. How will people react?



#### Friday, July 24, 2015

- E-cigarette companies are making flavors like Cherry Crush, and teen use is on the rise. What would you do if an underage person asked you to buy e-cigarettes for them?
- When out for Hibachi, a lot of diners not only want great food, they want to see the chef put on a great show. But what happens if you end up with the worst Hibachi cook of all time? Not only does he not know how to make good food, he can't do the basic tricks. What would you do?
- A bossy, entitled little girl is doing some shopping with her mom at a kid's clothing boutique, being extremely rude to the sales associate. How will other customers react?
- How will people react when they see/hear a crying baby left in a hot car? (OAD: 8/8/14)
- What would you do if you saw a mom taking her young son for a manicure and someone was criticizing her for doing such a "girlie" activity? What if it were the dad objecting? (OAD: 7/12/13)

#### Friday, July 31, 2015

- A young boy is talking to an empty chair at a café claiming he's having a meal with his "friend." When he asks bystanders to take a photo of the two of them, even going so far to ask for the picture to be retaken when he is unhappy with it, how will bystanders react?
- An absent-minded waiter neglects to provide menus, delivers items that diners didn't order, and then spends time telling them about his girlfriend troubles. How will the patrons react?
- A pregnant woman meets up for the first time at a restaurant with a gay couple who wants to adopt her baby. How will other diners react when a female patron tries to talk her out of giving her baby to a same-sex couple?
- What would you do if you witnessed two college kids putting a date rape drug in a girl's drink? (OAD: 6/6/14)
- When a controlling groom tags along with his bride while she chooses her wedding and bridesmaids dresses, criticizing his fiancé, her bridesmaids, and her dress choices, what will people do as they witness this "groomzilla" upset the bride's plans? (OAD: 7/11/14)

#### Friday, August 7, 2015

- How will diners react when observing a mother drinking heavily while also breastfeeding her baby?
- A wacky wine expert is conducting a tasting and offering customers some pretty strange ways of sampling the wine, including lapping it up like a dog. How will the customers react?
- What would you do if you saw a young girl, bored with her coloring book, start drawing on a café's expensive artwork? OAD: 7/25/14
- A criminal with a credit card skimmer is at a bar. As soon as a nearby customer and bartender look away, the criminal springs into action – swiping the credit card, stealing personal credit information, through the handheld device. Will anyone say anything when they see what's going on? OAD: 6/27/14

#### Friday, August 14, 2015

- A woman brings her Middle Eastern boyfriend to meet her white parents. When he arrives, the joyous news of their engagement takes a sour turn as her parents disapprove because they believe American girls should not marry Muslim men. How will bystanders react?
- A lesbian couple is registering at a baby store for items for their upcoming baby. The sales clerk does not think same sex couples should have children and has no problem voicing his opinion. How will other shoppers react?
- A customer is roaming the aisles, purposely damaging canned goods, produce, etc. because she thinks she will get a discount on the items. How will other shoppers react?
- The average cost of a wedding is over \$28,000 and the wedding dress can be a big piece of that pie. What will happen when a bridesmaid spills red wine on a dress at a bridal store? (OAD: 6/27/14)
- How will witnesses react when a man tries to weasel his way out of paying off a big bet he loses while shooting pool? (OAD: 6/20/14)

#### Friday, August 28, 2015 (Finale)

- A blind man at a café asks a fellow diner to verify how much cash he has. The diner says the blind man has four dollars when in fact, he has four \$20 bills – and she pockets most of his money. How will bystanders react?
- A group of teens are humiliating a homeless man on the boardwalk, promising to give him money if he earns it by doing what they ask. How will bystanders react?
- What happens when a young man is told that he shouldn't be buying clothes at a Newark, New Jersey fashion boutique specializing in urban wear — just because he's white? How will fellow shoppers react? (OAD: 6/20/14)

- It is one of the oldest carnival tricks in the book: a man will ask to guess your weight, height or age for a small fee. If he guesses wrong you get a prize, but if he guesses right he pockets the fee and you leave empty handed. But what if the game took it a bit too far and the "What Would You Do?" carnival worker did not just stop at guessing but actively tried to insult the contestants? How will bystanders react?
