'13 Reasons Why' – Parents and Kids Need to Talk About the Series Season 2 of the widely discussed Netflix series "13 Reasons Why" is out, and - like the first season - is generating a lot of discussion. This time around, it seems to be starting out with a more positive tone. Last year, many parents and school leaders raised red flags about the series. They were concerned that there was little discussion about the topic of self-harm or suicide prior to the series airing, along with concerns that some scenes could trigger old traumas among teens who had survived attempts to take their lives.
