DAVE BARD BROADCAST LIVE FROM ELIZABETHTOWN IL, A HISTORIC OHIO RIVER TOWN DURING THEIR ANNUAL HERITAGE FESTIVAL. DAVE INTERVIEWED VARIOUS BOARD MEMBERS OF THE HARDIN CO. MAIN ST. ORGANIZATION. THIS GROUP IS MADE UP OF CITIZEN LEADERS IN ROSICLARE AND ELIZABETHTOWN IL TO PROMOTE THE HISTORY AND TOURISM FOR BOTH RIVER TOWN COMMUNITIES. SPECIAL EVENTS WERE A FLEA MARKET ON THE GROUNDS OF THE HISTORIC ROSE HOTEL AND RIVER ROSE INN AREAS, A FUND RAISING DUCK RACE ON THE OHIO RIVER, AND A STREET PLAY HIGHLIGHTING THE AREA'S HISTORY PERFORMED BY LOCAL RESIDENTS. FOOD AND ENTERTAINMENT ROUNDED OUT THE FESTIVITIES.

CATHY HORTON INTERVIEWED STAFF OF THE HARRISBURG MEDICAL CENTER DURING THE SALINE CO. FAIR. HMC USED THE FAIR AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO PROMOTE THE HEALTH CARE INNOVATIONS THAT THEY HAVE RECENTLY UPGRADED OR MADE CHANGES TO IN ORDER TO BETTER SERVE THE HEALTHCARE NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITY. MONDAY 7/21, DAN ALLAN, A RURAL HEALTH STUDENT WAS INTERVIEWED REGARDING HIS PARTICIPATION IN THE RURAL INTERPROFESSIONAL HEALTH PROFESSIONS SUMMER PRECEPTORSHIP. DAN IS A SECOND YEAR MEDICAL STUDENT AND THIS PROGRAM WAS A PAID 6 WEEK EXPERIENCE WHERE HE SPENT TIME AT THE HARRISBURG MEDICAL CENTER, DOCTORS OFFICES, AND EGYPTIAN HEALTH DEPT. TO EXPERIENCE THE DAY TO DAY ACTIVITIES AT THESE FACILITIES AS IT RELATES TO THE UNIQUE AND INDIVIDUAL NEEDS OF THE RURAL HEALTH COMMUNITY. AS HE CONTINUES HIS EDUCATION THIS PROGRAM GIVES ITS PARTICIPANTS THE INFORMATION THEY NEED TO PERHAPS JOIN THE RURAL HEALTHCARE FIELD AS OPPOSED TO THE LARGER CITIES OPPORTUNITIES AS THERE IS A SHORTAGE OF SPECIALTY MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS IN RURAL COMMUNITIES.

ALSO INTERVIEWED WAS KENDRA MCHUGH, OFFICE MGR. AT ALEXANDER FAMILY PRACTICE AND GALATIA FAMILY PRACTICE. INFORMATION GIVEN ON WHAT SERVICES

THOSE OFFICES OFFER FROM BACK TO SCHOOL PHYSICALS, TO DOT CERTIFICATION AND REGULAR FAMILY PRACTICE. THIS INTERVIEW WAS CONDUCTED LIVE ON THE AIR ON TUES. 7/22/14. WED. JULY 23RD DR. JIM ALEXANDER, HARRISBURG FAMILY PRACTICE NOW AFFILIATED WITH HMC WAS INTERVIEWED REGARDING THE OPENING OF HIS NEW OFFICE IN HARRISBURG. WHAT SERVICES ARE OFFERED AND WHAT HIS HEALTHCARE PHILOSOPHY IS. FOLLOWING RODNEY SMITH, CEO OF HMC WAS INTERVIEWED REGARDING RECENT AWARDS WON BY HMC ESPECIALLY IN THE ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS FIELD. SEVENTY EIGHT SERVICE EXCELLENCE AWARDS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED IN RECENT YEARS. HE ALSO DISCUSSED WHAT HE SAW AS PRIORITY ISSUES FOR SMALLER RURAL HOSPITALS SUCH AS HMC. HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE STATE OF ILLINOIS BECOME MUCH MORE CURRENT ON THEIR MEDICAID PAYMENTS TO HOSPITALS. IT IS CHALLENGING TO OPERATE AT OPTIMUM CARE WHEN REIMBURSEMENTS ARE SHORT. THURS. CATHY HART WAS INTERVIEWED. SHE IS THE COORDINATOR OF SERVICES FOR HMC AND ITS SATELLITE SERVICES SUCH AS ALEXANDER FAMILY PRACTICE AND ELDORADO PRIMARY CARE IN ELDORADO IL. ON FRI. 8/25 DR. JOHN COOLEY, ELDORADO PRIMARY CARE WITH BEHAVIORAL HEALTH WAS INTERVIEWED REGARDING THE MENTAL HEALTH EVALUATIONS AND TREATMENTS WHICH ARE NOW BEING OFFERED TO ADULTS AND CHILDREN. FOLLOWING DR. MICHAEL HANDWERK THE DIR. OF PRACTICE ADMIN. WITH BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SPOKE ON THE NEW EXPANSION OF THE PHYSICAL BUILDING AS WELL AS STAFF AND PROGRAMS AT THE ELDORADO PRIMARY CARE FOR THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH DEPT.

SHOWCASED WERE THE 4-H MEMBERS DISCUSSING THEIR VARIOUS PROJECTS AT THE SHOWS, WHAT THEY LEARNED ABOUT AGRICULTURE THROUGH THEIR PROJECTS AND WHAT BENEFIT IT WAS TO THEIR LIVES. 4-H LEADERS WERE INTERVIEWED AS TO HOW IMPORTANT IT IS TO KEEP OUR YOUNGSTERS INTERESTED IN CAREERS IN AGRICULTURE. ANOTHER REPORT FEATURED KACEY ELLIS, AG TEACHER AT HARRISBURG HIGH SCHOOL AND MEMBER OF THE SALINE CO. YOUNG FARMERS ORGANIZATION. THIS RECENTLY REVIVED ORGANIZATION SPONSORED THE PETTING ZOO AT THE FAIR FOR YOUNGSTERS. KACEY URGED ANYONE WITH AN INTEREST IN PROMOTING AGRICULTURE, ESPECIALLY YOUNG PEOPLE, TO JOIN THE ORGANIZATION.

ANOTHER INTERVIEW WAS WITH TEEN MISSIONS LEADER, JEFF MOLDEY OF POSEYVILLE INDIANA. THE ORGANIZATION TRIPLE T, A CHRISTIAN YOUTH ORGANIZATION HAD A BOOTH AT THE FAIR AND WAS PROMOTING AN ACTIVE CHRISTIAN FAITH AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE AT THE FAIR.

AN INTERVIEW OPPORTUNITY WITH JANN RASCH WAS TAKEN AT THE TOWN AND COUNTRY COMMITTEE BOOTH. THIS GROUP IS OUT OF ELDORADO IL AND PRODUCES THE ANNUAL TOWN AND COUNTRY DAYS FESTIVAL IN ELDORADO IN SEPT. EACH YEAR AT THEIR PERMANENT BOOTH AT THE SALINE CO. FAIR, VOLUNTEERS COOK UP VARIOUS FAIR FOOD AND THE PROCEEDS ARE USED FOR T & C DAYS EACH YEAR.
