Becky Miller with Second Harvest Food Bank of the Mahoning Valley brings listeners up to date on the latest statistics in the tri county area (Mahoning, Trumbull & Columbiana counties). The need for emergency food assistance continues to grow and in 2014 there were over 700,00 requests. 1 in 6 people in the tri county area faces hunger and 1 in 4 are children. 53% of school students in the Mahoning valley are currently eligible for free food and reduced meals. Miller cites the economy in general and in particular the lack of wage growth as contributing factors.

The Need / Stats

Second Harvest provides food to those in need in the tri-county area through 148 programs provided by hunger-relief organizations, which include church pantries, homeless shelters, soup kitchens, shelters for battered women, and after-school programs.

For every \$1 given, the Food Bank can distribute \$11 worth of food.

1 in 4 children in the Mahoning Valley struggles with hunger.

In 2014, 20% of the people who received food assistance were seniors.

53% of the students in the Mahoning Valley are eligible for free and reduced-price meal programs.

In 2014, the Food Bank distributed 9.5 million pounds of food in the tri-county area.

In 2014, the Food Bank distributed over 2 million pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables.

The Food Bank is a volunteer-dependent organization, and last year volunteers gave more than 14,000 hours of their time.

There were over 700,000 requests for emergency food assistance in 2014.

1 in 6 people in the Mahoning Valley faces hunger.

92,000 people in the Mahoning Valley are food insecure, meaning that struggling families may not have consistent access to adequate food.

Every month, 40% of the households receiving food assistance must choose between paying for food and paying for utilities.

Every month, 35% of the households receiving food assistance must choose between paying for food and paying for medicine and medical care.

Every month, 37% of the households receiving food assistance must choose between paying for food and paying for transportation or gas for the car.
