

Human Traffickers are working Overtime during the Holidays.

Don't let them cash in. With the Holidays approaching there will be holidays parties and holiday shopping.

Day light savings time just kicked in so Darkness arrives earlier each day.

We want ever family to have a Happy and Safe Holiday.

1. Being mindful of your surrounds as always is the first step.

2. Try and shop as a Group and preferably in Daytime hours.

3. Schedule a Babysitter NOW dont wait. DO NOT take small children shopping during the busy season. "to easy to be distracted"

4. Use the BUDDY system: Bathrooms. Dressing rooms,

Food court, Play areas are usually around exits and entrances

ALSO: If purse snatch happened you wouldn't leave your child.

also, being in food court or play area is a major busy area and a traffickers play ground.

5. Do Not leave your child home alone while attending Holiday parties or shopping.

6. Do Not allow people to take snapshots of your child unless you research the company. Make sure they are ~~reputable~~. Accompany child with Santa

7. Apply for jobs directly at the company....do not answer an AD by yourself or at a pop up Kiosk. (help wanted for Holiday)

8. Be vigilant about checking childs computer, phone or any electronic device.

9. Use a hand santizer / disinfectant of your own or the one store provide BEFORE using the cart (drugs on handle of cart)

10. Park close to store /resturant/ Under a Light

11. Have keys in hand/ Lock the door immediately as you get in vehicle

12. DO NOT press your lock opener far from your vehicle that it advertises which is yours.

13. When pressing car code DO NOT allow others to see CODE

15. Text a friend or family member upon entering each location. (they will have a timeline and travel main roads)

16. Do Not post on social media where you will be during the holidays.Post after you are home safely

17.ALWAYS reach out to MALL security or STORE security or management

If you feel you are in a compromising situations. If you are outside the shopping area and need assistance dial 911.

Becky Miller is the Marketing Dir. For Second Harvest Food Bank of Mahoning Valley. The agency services those in need of food assistance for Mahoning, Trumbull and Columbiana counties in Northeast Ohio through 148 programs provided by church pantries, homeless shelters, soup kitchens, shelters for battered women and after school programs. The program created awareness for the 11th annual Feed Our Valley campaign which runs Nov 5-Dec 15, 2017.

Food Bank Stats

Second Harvest provides food to those in need in the tri-county area through 148 programs provided by hunger-relief organizations, which include church pantries, homeless shelters, soup kitchens, shelters for battered women, and after-school programs.

For every \$1 given, the Food Bank can distribute \$11 worth of food or approximately 5 meals.

- 1 in 4 children in the Mahoning Valley struggles with hunger.
- 1 in 6 people in the Mahoning Valley faces hunger.

Hungry People Make Tough Choices – Hunger in America 2014

Every month, 40% of the households receiving food assistance must choose between paying for food and paying for utilities.

Every month, 35% of the households receiving food assistance must choose between paying for food and paying for medicine and medical care.

Every month, 37% of the households receiving food assistance must choose between paying for food and paying for transportation or gas for the car.

In 2016....

The Food Bank distributed 10.5 million pounds of food including 3 million pound of fresh fruits and vegetables.

20% of the people who received food assistance were seniors.

31% of people who received food assistance were children.

The Food Bank is a volunteer-dependent organization, and last year volunteers gave more than 14,000 hours of their time.

Filled 591,275 requests for food assistance in Columbiana, Mahoning and Trumbull counties.

Stats are from Feeding America's Map the Meal Gap 2017 and Hunger in America 2014, and from the Food Bank.

Please see the attached flyers for upcoming Access Health FREE medical clinic nights, dental and vision appointments. Feel free to post within your organization and share with clients, friends, and family. The dates and times vary, so please direct individuals to call the number listed on flyer to make an appointment.

In order to qualify for our services clients must be between ages of 19-64, uninsured and making 200% or below federal poverty level. Those with medical coverage, but lacking dental and vision coverage are eligible for those services if they meet income guidelines. Please call our office at 330-373-0703, ext 2 with any questions pertaining to eligibility.

In addition to the normal offerings, we have an additional dental clinic coming up on Thursday November 9th in the evening. Appointments must be made, no walk-ins. Any questions, please ask. As many of you know, Access Health lost funding for the Navigator program and we are no longer able to offer in-person assistance for health insurance enrollment on the Marketplace or Medicaid. We are still providing assistance to medical, dental and vision needs.
