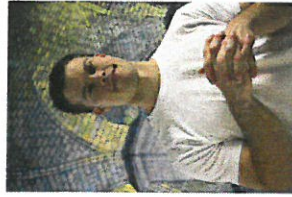

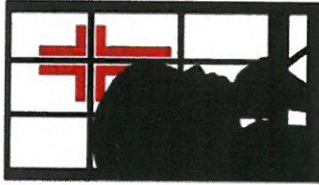

Second Harvest Distributed Record 9.5 Million Lbs. of Food in 2014

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio – (January 15, 2015) Last year was a record breaker for Second Harvest Food Bank of the Mahoning Valley as it distributed 9.5 million lbs. of food — the equivalent of more than 6.3 million meals — to hungry people in Columbiana, Mahoning and Trumbull counties. In 2014, for the fourth consecutive year, Second Harvest distributed more than 9 million lbs. of food, increasing distribution by 368,000 lbs. over the previous year.

“We are pleased in our efforts to meet the need, but saddened that the need is so great,” said Second Harvest Food Bank Executive Director Mike Iberis.

Despite a slight upswing in the economy, the Mahoning Valley’s poverty rate remains above the national average. Last year, Second Harvest’s 153 member agencies fed an average of more than 15,000 people each week.

“Unfortunately, we don’t see a lot on the horizon to give us hope that 2015 will see fewer hungry people, but we are grateful so many donors and volunteers support our efforts and those of our member agencies to provide food when and where it’s needed in our community,” Iberis said.

In 2014, Second Harvest increased distribution not only through member agencies but by expanding the *BackPack Program* which provides food to school children for the weekend, and the *Mobile Pantry Program*, which takes food to outlying areas where there are no pantries or other sources for emergency food assistance.

“We are continually looking at ways to get more food to more people more efficiently,” said Iberis. “This means not only cultivating new agencies in outlying and under-served areas but also providing immediate food assistance through the mobile pantry program.”

Additionally, the Food Bank is committed to providing hungry children, seniors, veterans and families in the Valley with more nutritious foods, such as fresh fruits and vegetables.

Second Harvest solicits, stores and distributes food to hunger-relief organizations in Columbiana, Mahoning and Trumbull counties. The Food Bank is a storehouse for large quantities of donated food and USDA commodities that are distributed to 153 hunger-relief organizations located throughout the tri-county service area. These member agencies include church pantries, homeless shelters and soup kitchens, shelters for battered women, and after-school programs.

The Food Bank also educates the community about hunger in our tri-county service area and advocates for those that are poor.

Second Harvest Food Bank relies on the financial support of donors. For every \$1 given, the Food Bank distributes \$15 worth of food, which is equivalent to six meals.

“Our ability to distribute more food is, in no small part, due to the donors who give so generously, the thousands of volunteers who come each week, food donors who give on a regular basis, the support we receive from the businesses that conduct food drives and fundraisers throughout the year, and the numerous in-kind donors who maintain our vehicles, provide gasoline for our trucks and publish our newsletter,” said Iberis.

Second Harvest Food Bank of the Mahoning Valley began in the early 1980s when a group of lay and religious community leaders realized that while people were going hungry, companies were throwing away unused, but still nutritious, edible food. An effort was started to get these companies to donate food to one central location in order to ease distribution to the many local charities already engaged in the fight against hunger.

In 1994, Second Harvest became a certified member of Feeding America, the nation’s largest domestic hunger-relief organization. As a member of Feeding America, it is the designated recipient of national food donors and retailers. The Food Bank also procures food donations from local companies like Giant Eagle and Sparkle Markets, as well as through food drives and campaigns like Harvest for Hunger.
