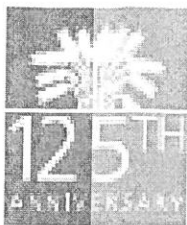

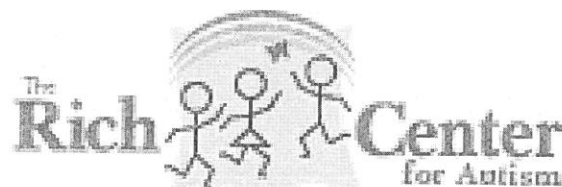

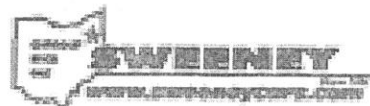

Glenn Johnston, Vice Pres. of the UAW local 11-12 and Dave Green, Pres. of UAW local 11-14 are partnering with the March of Dimes for their March for Babies on May 20, 2012 at Austintown Park. They discussed the effort to engage our valley population in the walk. Their respective teams for this event include hundreds of walkers from the GM Lordstown Plant. General Motors partners with the March of Dimes nationally. Sherri Horvatt is the Ambassador Family member for the Mahoning Valley and she talked about her experience with premature birth and how the March of Dimes has assisted her. Connie Knight is Community Director for the Northeast Ohio Division of the March of Dimes and talked about how the March of Dimes benefits families with their research as well as the need to raise more funding toward that effort. The March of Dimes funds important research and programs that help babies begin healthy lives. The organization currently focuses on preventing premature births and assisting babies who are born prematurely. The premature birth rate has dropped 3 percent due to research and efforts of the March of Dimes.

On Monday, April 30th at 10 am, we are scheduled to be at Cumulus Broadcasting located at 1040 Simon Road in Youngstown. The stations are just off of Midlothian Avenue, around the corner from the Schwebel's Bakery. Our event is volunteer driven and the message should come from our events chairs and ambassador family ;) I of course will be there if needed—but I know the 3 of you can handle this.

We will begin the show with our co-chairs. Dave and Glenn, I would like you to talk about the walk upcoming on Sunday May 20th at the Austintown Township Park, you can sign up on www.marchforbabies.org. You are proud to announce that General Motors is the presenting sponsor this year and that you, along with your co-chairs, have agreed to take on the Leadership role for the March of Dimes, because... *whatever your feelings about the charity*. Highlights could include;

- Every week in Ohio there are over 300 babies born prematurely and 22 babies will die before their first birthday.
- Pre-term babies face a host of difficulties; from breathing to feeding problems and the March of Dimes is at the forefront of lifesaving research for these babies.
- 75 cents of every dollar donated goes into research, programs and services

Then if one of you could talk about March for Babies events, highlights;

- March for Babies is a family event with activities for everyone and we are expecting near 1,000 Valley residents to join us this year to raise our walksite goal of \$140,000
- Our Taste of March for Babies area this year will feature Panera Bagels, Pizza Hut pizza, Chipotle's chips and salsa and Rita's frozen custard and much more.
- The Kids Zone area again will have the bounce houses from Austintown Bounce, the friendly Phantoms hockey mascot and a performance from Mahoning Valley's own Hey Kids group
- A Chinese auction with gift baskets from the Mahoning Valley Scrappers, Panera Café, Pampered Chef, Candywood Golf Course and gift cards from many Valley restaurants and stores.
- On Sunday May 20, registration begins at noon, the walk kicks off at 1 pm at Austintown Township Park on Kirk Road

Description of Issues:

Since its inception in 1990, the Strimbu Memorial Fund has raised close to 2-million and awarded 1.8-million in scholarships to area high school students and grants to various community programs. 99% of the money raised during the annual fundraiser, The Strimbu Memorial BBQ, supports these scholarships and grants. Trumbull County Judge Ron Rice and John "Chip" Matrian are members of the Strimbu Board of Directors. They discuss the 23rd Annual BBQ, scheduled for May 2nd, and outline the scholarship programs they support in detail. The fund awards leadership scholarships of \$1000 each to 11 local high school students in the Mahoning and Shenango Valleys. One student receives a \$10,000 scholarship. The boardmembers also make monetary donations from the fund to people and organizations in need and John Matrian stated that often they see an article in the local newspaper highlighting this "need" and the donations are made anonymously from the Strimbu Fund.
